## Remodeling You Can Do Yourself: Removing Carpet

Removing old carpet is a great way to give your home a new look. This D.I.Y. approach can be economical, and you can ensure that the floor below is prepared (or preserved) to your standards. When we bought our house, it had been recently carpeted, but we decided to reveal the hardwood floors this summer.

Before you start ripping out the carpet, however, decide the final goal of your remodeling. Do you want to save what's underneath the carpet? Some homes, like ours here in the Woodlands, may have hardwood floors beneath the wall-towall carpeting. Pull up a corner of the carpet and see what's underneath if you haven't yet.

Next, decide how you will dispose of the old carpet. If you want the installers of a new floor to haul away the old carpet, communicate this in advance and figure it into your price. Also, make sure that they know not to charge you for the time to tear out the carpet. You can call Republic Services at (925) 685-4711 to arrange for your once/year pick-up of up to 14 4'x2' carpet rolls. We used our once/year pick-up to remove the carpet padding and some of the carpet. You can also find out what Republic Services charges for disposal of carpet at their dump in Martinez. If you don't have a truck of your own or access to one, you can hire a hauling service, or rent a truck. With our remaining carpet, I created a Craigslist post under "Free," because people often want used carpet, as long as it's in decent condition. You can put the carpet rolls in your side-yard for easy pick-up. In my recent experience, the carpet was gone within 2 hours of posting to Craigslist.

Move the furniture out of the area where you will be removing carpet. You will need access to the entire floor, but you can move the furniture to one half of the room, remove the carpet, and then move the furniture onto the surface that is carpet-free and work on the other half of the carpet if space is an issue. Next:

- Vacuum the old carpet prior to removal to help to cut down on dust.
- Wear a dust mask. Wear heavy work gloves, since you will be working around staples, tacks, and rough carpet edges. Also, wear sturdy, thick-soled, closed-toe shoes that will protect your feet if you step on a tack strip or staple.
- Pull up the edge of the carpet, near any wall. Use pliers to grip the fibers if you need to.

- Use a utility knife or carpet knife to slice the carpet into manageable strips and roll the strips up as you go. If you are trying to salvage the floor underneath, make sure you do not cut grooves in the floor with the knife. Lift the carpet away from the floor as you cut or remove the carpet in larger pieces and cut it up somewhere else. Know what a manageable strip is. The roll you produce must be something you can lift and move, and it must fit in whatever vehicle will be used to transport the old carpet away.
- Remove the carpet padding underneath. Carpet padding is usually just stapled down. Pull it up, cut it into smaller strips if necessary for handling, and roll it as you did the carpet.
- Carry the rolls of carpet and padding out of the rooms where you are working.
- Remove the tack strips, unless you plan to reuse them for new carpeting. Wedge a flat bar (pry bar) underneath of the tack strip (the strip with nails coming through to the top). Make sure you have gloves and eye protection, because it can pop up and puncture skin.
- Pull up staples left from the padding. Pliers and a flatbladed screwdriver will help get underneath. Many staples will have to be pulled up slowly to avoid breaking them.
- Clean the floor. Sweep or vacuum as necessary to remove debris left from the old carpet. Mop the floor. You may find additional staples that will need pulling up.

This project took my husband and me two weekends to complete, but it can probably be done in one weekend without interruption. Removing the staples was the most time consuming, as we found 3 different types of carpet remnants, and removing the tack strips was also a big part of the job. The time investment was worthwhile, however. The wood floors are easier to clean than our carpet was and give the house a spacious look. Next step: refinishing the wood floors.

## The Woodlands' newest stop for cold desserts, **Ice Monster**,

opened in the Citrus Market Place in late June. Ice Monster features a variety of desserts and "bubble teas", which include a milk or fruit base and big tapioca balls for texture. Ice Monster is a real departure from the other ice cream and yogurt shops in the neighborhood and around Walnut Creek, modeled on a Taiwanese chain of frozen desserts. Ice Monster features a special machine that shaves a block of ice into extremely thin layers, creating a light snowy texture.

Its menu has shaved ice concoctions which allow you to mix a variety of rich, milk-based shaved ice flavors with syrups and toppings ranging from fruits and nuts to balls of tapioca. Servings are large enough to share and range in price from \$7-10 depending on how many fixings you add. There are also dessert crepes and waffles, as well a range of teas. The grandest item on the menu is the signature Ice Cream Bread House, featuring a dense ice cream bread center and a range of fruits, syrups and other toppings on top - a real spectacle, for \$13.50.

## **DROUGHT TIPS**

With a record drought underway, the Contra Costa Water District has implemented a voluntary program targeting a 15% reduction in water use by its customers. Now that the not-so-rainy season is behind us it's a good time to dust off some old water saving wisdom, along with a few new tips as well. Here are some tips to help you get to your 15%.

#### Inside the home:

Happily, when it comes to washing your dishes, the best things to do are also the easiest:

- Washing dishes in the dishwasher is more efficient then doing them by hand (score!)
- Pre-rinse your dishes as little as possible before putting them in the dishwasher (double-score!), especially if your dishwasher is a newer model, which will clean more thoroughly than an older one.
- Instead of scrubbing your pots and pans under-running water, let them soak awhile instead. Go have a cocktail and clean 'em later (triple score!). If you're lucky maybe your spouse will end up cleaning them instead. Be strategic.

## You can save water in the bathroom too, though it's not as much fun as in the kitchen:

- Keep a couple of empty pitchers by your shower, and fill them as the water gets warm enough for you to jump in. Otherwise this water just gets wasted. Then use it to water your plants.
- Take a stop-start shower, where you turn the water off while you are lathering or shampooing and then back on just to rinse. Definitely a pain, but not so bad in the summer when it's warm.
- Use the same stop-start approach in the sink when you are brushing your teeth or shaving. To clarify, you do not actually need to be in the sink for this to work.
- Gross but effective- rely on the old potty-time mantra, "If it's yellow, let it mellow, if it's brown, flush it down". Just remember to discontinue if you're having company.

#### Outside the home:

Take pride in your brown lawn- it's a great way to signal to your neighbors that you are doing your part to help out! Give judgmental, disapproving looks as you walk by your neighbors with lush green lawns- peer pressure can be fun! Virtually all grasses will recover once they receive moisture at the end of the drought.

You are still gonna want to water your trees during the drought, they may suffer from stress and attract insects if you don't. There are things you can do to use less water however:

- Apply 2-3 inches of organic mulch.
- Bury a soaker hose just above the tree's roots. Run it once a month for about an hour for a good, deep water.

#### General tips:

- Always water in the early morning or the evening.
  Watering in the middle of the day is not a good idea, because much of the water evaporates instead of getting to the plants.
  - Water deeply but less frequently for better and more water efficient results.
    - For extra credit, get a smart controller which manages your watering times and frequencies based on weather patterns, soil moisture, evaporation rates, etc.

#### Free Home Water Use Survey:

On request, the CCWD will come to your home, inspect your irrigation system and make water saving tips. They will even give you free, high-efficiency shower heads and kitchen faucet aerators. To make an appointment, follow this link- www.ccwater.com/conserve/singlefamily.asp

Some of these tips are more extreme and only make sense while the drought persists but others are good idea no matter how much rain has fallen. For now our water reductions are voluntarydo your part to help until the drought ends.




