
The Orchards at Walnut Creek

The Woodlands Association recently spoke with Ethan Bindernagel, Sr. Planner with the City of Walnut Creek, when Mr. Bindernagel gave us information regarding The Orchards at Walnut Creek development. As you have probably seen through the site's fencing, earthwork permits are in effect and grading began on the 25-acre site on 6/29.

The building permits are being comprehensively processed to ensure that what was proposed and approved is actually what will be built, built safely and built to code. To put things into perspective, the 25-acre site is similar in size to the whole of the core downtown of Walnut Creek. There are many pipes, conduits, dry utilities, sewer lines, and more to be reviewed in the process.

The opening date for The Orchards is estimated for October 2016 rather than October 2015. Please Drive Slowly!

As school begins and our neighborhood

sees more children out and about, we ask

that you please drive slowly! Here are some facts about speeding:

-Most speeders in your neighborhood live in your neighborhood. (KKAD25)

-Speeding in residential neighborhoods represents the single greatest complaint issue to police departments and city council representatives throughout the U.S. (KKAD25)

-It is not unusual for speeders to be clocked in excess of 40 mph (and even 50 mph on occasion) in 25-mph zones. (KKAD25)

Speeding extends the distance necessary to stop a vehicle.

- At 20 mph the total stopping distance needed is 69 feet.
- At 30 mph, the distance needed is 123 feet.
- At 40 mph, the distance needed is 189 feet which may not be enough distance and time for you to avoid hitting an object or person on the road (USDOT, NHSTA)

If you hit a pedestrian

- At 20 mph 5% will die
- At 30 mph 45% will die
- At 40 mph 85% will die (USDOT)

Drive slower for your safety and for those around you. Please help keep our neighborhood safe!



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

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A Garage Sale Can Change Your Life!




Can the Woodlands garage sale on Sunday, October 4, 2015 be the sign it's time to TURBO TIDY your home? Four tips to get you started:

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Page 14 Recipe: A Modern Take on Pineapple Upside Down Cake

Different from the retro dessert with the obligatory maraschino cherries, this Pineapple Upside Down cake delivers a tropical taste that cannot be beat! After some testing, defrosted frozen pineapple proved to be the best (sometimes fresh pineapple may not be as sweet or juicy as you need it to be and canned pineapple is lacking in fresh flavor). Pineapple juice in the cake batter helps deepen the pineapple flavor. A deep dish pie plate works well for cooking the cake. If you don't have one you can use a 9 inch cake pan- make sure to butter liberally. There are countless - try this with berries or peaches now and in the fall with sautéed apples and apple cider replacing the pineapple juice in the batter!

Topping:


1 ½ cup defrosted pineapple chunks (I used the small pieces from Trader Joe's- these product a nice mosaic looking pattern on top, but if using larger chunks- just arrange as close as possible in one laver.

6 tablespoons (85 grams) unsalted butter, 3/4 cup (145 grams) packed light brown sugar, and a pinch of salt.

Batter:

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter at room temperature
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 tablespoon dark rum

1/2 cup unsweetened pineapple juice Liberally butter a deep dish 9 inch glass or glazed ceramic pie plate or 9 inch cake pan



Preheat oven to 350°F, place rack in middle of oven.

Topping: Melt butter in small saucepan. Add brown sugar and simmer over medium heat, four about three to four minutes. Remove from heat and pour mixture into buttered pie dish or cake pan. Place pineapple on top of sugar mixture- you can create a pattern here if you like- remember this will be the top of your cake.

Cake: Combine flour, baking powder, and salt and whisk to combine, set aside. Beat butter in a until light and fluffy, then gradually beat in granulated sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add in vanilla and rum. With mixer on low, add half of flour mixture until blended. Beat in pineapple juice, and then add remaining flour mixture, mixing until just combined.

Spread batter over pineapple evenly. Bake cake for about 45 minutes until golden brown on top and a tester comes out clean. Remove cake from oven and let stand for 5 minutes. Carefully place another cake or rack on top of the pie plate and carefully invert the cake and lift off pie dish or cake pan. If a chunk of pineapple falls off, simply place it back on. Scrape any topping from pie plate onto cake. Let cool on rack and serve warm or at room temperature

This can be made ahead! Wrap well and refrigerate for up to one day- bring up to room temperature before serving. Or to freeze: once cool, wrap in plastic wrap, then foil and freeze. Defrost completely in the fridge. Before serving, heat in a 200 degree oven until warm. Great on its own, it is also fabulous served with vanilla or coconut ice cream.


