#### A Woodlands Holiday Tradition Continues





Have you seen the orange yard signs popping up in the Woodlands in support of a new Northgate Unified School District? If you are still wondering what this is all about, I hope you'll take a few moments to learn more about this campaign, because it has the potential to bring important positive changes to our local Northgate schools and our community. Nearly 500 people in the Woodlands have already signed the petition to put this proposal before the County and State officials who will spend a year reviewing our request.

Unlike past efforts to separate our schools from the troubled Mt. Diablo district, this effort would lead to a new community-based school district being created just for the Northgate area. We value our local schools and the educators who work so hard with our students, but we believe they could be much more successful under a smaller, local administration focused on the needs of our students. Even if your children have graduated from high school, our schools remain a focal point of our community and a source of great pride. Every year, more young families join our neighborhood, and their children – our future leaders -- deserve your support!

#### **Roasted Acorn Squash with Balsamic Reduction**

Acorn squash are my most favorite squash. When sliced and roasted they are flavorful with a creamy texture. I have included just acorn squash here but this method works for any root vegetable or winter squash- parsnips and butternut squash are also great options! Reduced balsamic vinegar is a great secret weapon to have in the kitchen and its uses are limitless. Try it drizzled over fresh tomatoes and basil or fresh berries in the summer or even drizzled on vanilla ice cream! You can roast the squash a day ahead- keep in the refrigerator and heat in the oven until warmed through then drizzle with the reduction and garnish when ready to serve!

- 2 acorn squash- washed and dried
- 3 Tablespoons Extra Virgin Olive Oil
- 1 teaspoon Kosher Salt
- 2 sprigs rosemary

1 cup balsamic vinegar (not anything super expensive)

Garnishes (Choose one or completely optional) Sliced Toasted Almonds Pomegranate Seeds Pistachios Toasted Pecans or Walnuts

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F.
- 2. Wash and dry the acorn squash. Peel just the ridges of the squash with a vegetable peeler (this gives a beautiful striped look but you can opt to not peel at all if preferred)
- 3. Slice off the very top stem, then cut in half lengthwise.
- 4. Scoop out seeds and slice each into half inch slices (slice across the ridges so that pieces are half circle shape)
- 5. In a large bowl, toss sliced squash, olive oil, salt and two rosemary springs (no need to chop as these will be removed once squash is roasted).
- 6. Roast on a sheet pan lined with parchment paper or foil for 40-45 minutes until golden brown and tender.
- 7. While squash is roasting, in a large saucepan (the wider the pan the more quickly the balsamic will reduce), bring the balsamic vinegar to a boil over high heat. Boil for approximately 8 minutes until thickened (it will continue to thicken as it cools). A good way to test is to coat the back of a spoon with the vinegar and drag your finger across- if it leaves a trail and is visibly thicker it is done. For 1 cup of vinegar it should yield about 1/3 cup reduction (consistency of thin honey/thick maple syrup when done).
- 8. To serve- arrange the hot squash on a platter and drizzle with the balsamic syrup and sprinkle with garnish of your choice.




