SHADELANDS GATEWAY SPECIFIC PLAN MOVES AHEAD CITY COUNCIL APPROVES BY UNANIMOUS VOTE

On Tuesday evening, June 17th, Walnut Creek's City Council voted 5-0 to approve the Shadelands Gateway Specific Plan and The Orchards at Walnut Creek Development Project. This was the 25th meeting sponsored by the City of Walnut Creek, and it represented the final step in the approval process following nearly 3 years of meeting and review associated with the project. With approval in hand, Safeway plans to break ground in time to move to its new location in The Orchards on October 1, 2015, after its current lease at Encina Grande Shopping Center expires on September 30, 2015. Whole Foods is expected to open a store at Encina Grande and become the new grocery anchor there.

This was the last in a series of recent meetings that have been well attended by members of the community with an interest in the proposal and its outcome. The City Council was originally expected to reach a decision at its June 3rd, 2014 meeting, only to deliberate for hours and then postpone its decision after nearly 50 members of the public took to the podium, expressing both support and concern about the proposed development. On May 22nd the Planning Commission had a final review of the proposed development and voted to move the proposal on to the City Council. This standing-room only meeting was heavily attended by members of

the community, with citizens expressing both support and opposition to the project.

Public comment, both in favor of and in opposition to the project has been strong, especially at these recent meetings. Most objections focused on traffic concerns, economic viability, environmental impact and the potential for urban decay at Citrus Marketplace. In the absence of a clear consensus on the matter, after two neighborhood surveys were conducted, the Woodlands Association elected not to take a position in support of, or opposition to the project. The association did thank the city, and Safeway, for keeping the community informed throughout the process and acknowledged the changes to the design that incorporated neighborhood feedback.

C.E.R.T. TRAINING COMING UP IN SEPTEMBER

The next round of Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.) training will begin this September, culminating with a drill on October 25. C.E.R.T. is looking for representatives from the Woodlands (and other neighborhoods) to participate. The goal of CERT is to teach people the skills they need to pull together and safely help their community in the event of disaster, as the demand for emergency services will likely exceed available resources.

CERT trainees go through a basic 20-hour training, spread across seven weeks, and are sworn in as volunteer Disaster Service Workers for the City of Walnut Creek. When disaster strikes, CERT volunteers check on their family's safety first, and then gather at their pre-designated CERT Staging Area to work with other CERTs in helping the surrounding neighborhoods and gathering information for the City's Emergency Operations Center.

The City of Walnut Creek is divided into 8 CERT areas. The Woodlands is located in the Northgate area, which stores one main cache of emergency supplies and two smaller caches. One of the smaller caches is located in the Woodlands. The Northgate area is the largest of the 8 areas in Walnut Creek, but also has the smallest number of community participants. The Spring C.E.R.T. class recently completed its drill on Saturday, May 31st. Out of the approximate 65 participants, seven were from

the Northgate area, including two Woodlands residents.

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
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
