Thinking Outside the Bubble: The Need to Re-evaluate Standardized

Testing (Part 1 of 2)

Tick! The timer goes off. An African-American student who lives in a public housing project in the Bronx begins anxiously filling in bubbles. He stumbles a few times in answering reading comprehension questions about things he has never heard of, like tea saucers. A few weeks later the student gets his 'below average' test results back. African-Americans, Hispanics, and low-income students consistently score below privileged white and Asian students (Rooks). But why is this? As Albert Einstein once said, "Everyone is a genius, but if you judge a fish on its ability to climb a tree, it will spend its whole life believing that it is stupid." In other words, if students are tested on things they have never been exposed to due to their socioeconomic class, they could be misevaluated leading to consequences for themselves and their community. The following week his school is forced to close because of a lack of funding due to low test scores. Unfortunately, with the current system, this is the story for many schools in low income areas. Apart from socially biased questions, the high-stakes of standardized tests cause unhealthy levels of stress for students and teachers. Finally, all the time spent teaching to the test limits time that could be spent on quality education. The use of standardized tests should be re-evaluated because it limits quality education, causes severe stress, and is socially biased.

Standardized tests limit education because they cause teaching to the test and do not measure what is meaningful. The Center on Education Policy reported in 2007 that social studies, science, art, music, physical education, lunch, and recess are were cut from 44 percent of schools in the nation after No Child Left Behind was passed in 2001 (Kamenetz, 28). These subjects and activities help to make a student well rounded. For example, having knowledge of social studies promotes understanding of world issues and involvement in the community. Music and art allow for creativity. Standardized tests emphasize a narrowed curriculum of math and language arts. Neuroscientists at MIT teamed up with Harvard and Brown Universities in a study that found that students' fluid intelligence, or their ability to use reasoning in new situations was not applied in standardized tests. Students who scored high on standardized math tests showed no greater fluid intelligence (Kamenetz, 14). This study shows that standardized tests do not test skills needed in the real world. The real world demands skills such as a working memory, the ability to process information quickly, and the ability to solve complex problems. As for Language Arts, the focus is more on reading than writing because it is easier to grade a multiple choice answer sheet than an essay. The reading comprehension questions focus only on comprehension not higher order-critical thinking. The writing portion is similarly inadequate. The writing portion

on standardized tests commonly asks you to write a 5 paragraph essay, which test students based on correct mechanics and length rather than creativity, rhetorical dimensions, and purpose ("How Standardized Tests Shape-and Limit-Student Learning"). While standardized tests limit quality education, they also lead to high levels of stress.

Standardized tests cause severe stress for many students and teachers. According to the Sacramento Bee, "test-related jitters, especially among young students, are so common that the Stanford-9 exam comes with instructions on what to do with a test booklet in case a student vomits on it" (qtd. "Is the Use of Standardized Tests Improving Education in America?"). Test makers obviously consider vomiting a common side effect of test taking. But what causes this anxiety? Firstly, many standardized tests are high-stakes meaning they determine aspects of education not just for students, but for teachers and schools as well. For students, scoring poorly means not getting into a certain class, not getting into a certain college, or even not graduating. Research dating back to the 1950s has shown that 25 to 40 percent of students suffer anxiety significant enough to depress test performance and that these anxious students perform 12 percent worse on average" (Kamenetz, 18). Test related anxiety is prevalent and can affect the scores. On top of that many students face pressure from their parents to do well on these tests. Kamenetz writes that, "The total test preparation, tutoring, and counseling market in the United States was estimated at \$13.5 billion by 2015, and the global private tutoring market was estimated to pass a whopping \$78.2 billion" (Kamenetz, 19). It is alarming that the pressure to do well on these tests has led to a growing billion dollar industry. The money invested in students to do well on these tests adds to the highstakes of testing. For the teacher, high-stakes testing causes pressure to teach to the test. Teaching to the test not only limits student's education, but can lead to cheating. An investigation done by the Atlanta Journal Constitution in 2012 revealed that 196 school districts throughout the nation showed evidence of cheating (Kamenetz, 29). After investing many hours of test preparation, teachers are inclined to do anything it takes to raise their student's test scores. They know if the scores are too low, their school faces the possibility of closing and they will lose their jobs. Could students and teachers look beyond the stress of high-stakes testing to see possible benefits?

Roasted Vegetable Sandwich

I am far from vegetarian, but I have some good friends that are and enjoy coming up with great tasting options that usually end up pleasing the vegetarians and omnivores alike! Side dishes are easy—main courses always seem to stump me. We recently planned a hike and picnic lunch to follow and wanted to be sure the vegetarian option was as hearty, delicious and full of flavor as other dishes that contained meat. The resulting sandwich was a hit, and packed with bold flavors. Substitute your favorite ingredients (grilled mushrooms would be a great addition), and you can always add cold cuts or grilled meats to this if you must! Each component can be enjoyed separately, and benefit from being made the night before. Assemble the sandwiches up to several hours ahead—wrap in plastic wrap and keep refrigerated. When well wrapped, these sandwiches travel very well.

1 loaf focaccia or very soft ciabatta, sliced horizontally.

½ cup olive tapenade (Trader Joe's has a great one)

- 1 recipe Roasted Eggplant
- 1 recipe balsamic roasted beets, sliced into rounds
- 8 oz. Feta cheese- sliced or crumbled
- 2 Tablespoons flat leaf parsley, chopped
- 2 Tablespoons fresh mint leaves, chopped
- 1 Tablespoon capers, drained or rinsed if using those packed in salt, chopped.

Roasted Eggplant

1 eggplant, washed and dried, sliced into ½ -3/4 pieces

3 Tablespoons extra virgin olive oil salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 400°F.

Brush both sides of eggplant slices with oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place on baking sheet lined with foil or parchment paper (I find parchment is best since it doesn't stick at all).

Roast for about 20 minutes or until soft. If it looks like it is starting to dry out, brush on a little extra oil.

Once cool, wrap and refrigerate until ready to use.

Balsamic Roasted Beets

4 beets (skin on, not trimmed)

Olive Oil

Salt

2 T Balsamic Vinegar

2 T Extra Virgin Olive Oil

Preheat oven to 400°F.

Wash and dry beets.

Place each beet on a sheet of foil and drizzle with olive oil, sprinkle with salt.

Wrap each beet in foil and place on sheet pan.

Roast until beets are tender (test with knife). This takes about an hour. Once cool enough to handle (if you have disposable latex gloves time to grab them) using the back of a knife (not the shard part, scrape the skin off the beets—it should come off fairly easily. Remove top and fibrous root end. Slice into rounds and toss with balsamic vinegar and olive oil. Add salt and pepper to taste.

To assemble sandwich:

Spread each side of the bread with olive tapenade and chopped capers. Place eggplant slices so they are slightly overlapping, on the bottom half of the bread.

Layer on the sliced beets, slightly overlapping.

Add the sliced feta and sprinkle on the herbs.

Place top of bread and cut into two large halves, then each half into four pieces—I recommend using a toothpick to hold each small sandwich together. Can be wrapped and stored in fridge until ready to enjoy!
