Creation of a Northgate Unified School District


September 10 marked the official kick-off day of the petition drive supporting the creation of a Northgate Unified School District.

The objective of the local, non-profit group Northgate Community Advocacy for our Public Schools (Northgate CAPS) is to create a new K-12 district made up of five schools: Bancroft Elementary, Valle Verde Elementary, Walnut Acres Elementary, Foothill Middle, and Northgate High. All residents who are currently assigned to any one of these schools would be served by the new district. Supporters of the effort strongly believe that a smaller, community-based district would be more accountable and responsive to the needs of its students and teachers.

The process to create a new school district is arduous and slow-moving. The founders of Northgate CAPS have worked for two years to build the structure around this effort and to complete an extensive report which explains how NUSD would meet the California State Board of Education's criteria for district reorganization. The next step is for the Contra Costa County District Organization Committee to approve the report. Following the county's approval, the report will be sent to the California State Board of Education for review. After approval at the state level, the community will have a local election vote to create the new district.

Before Contra Costa County will review the report, however, sufficient signatures need to be gathered during the petition drive. Those who sign the petition must be both registered to vote in Contra Costa County and live within the attendance area of one of the five schools included in the new district. It is required that the petition be signed by 25% of residents who meet this criteria; a total of approximately 6,000 signatures. These signatures must be collected and submitted by February 28, 2017.

Dedicated volunteers have been going door-to-door within their neighborhoods gathering signatures. Residents have also had the opportunity to sign the petition at fixed locations in front of schools and inside local businesses. Upcoming petitioning locations include:

Mayor Loella Haskew was elected to the Walnut City Council in November 2012. She will serve as Mayor in 2016, and was Mayor Pro Tem in 2015. Before being elected to Council, she served on the Community Blue Ribbon Task Force on Fiscal Health and the Arts Vision Task Force, and is a Walnut Creek Citizens Institute graduate.

Ms. Haskew has an extensive history of community service. Currently, she serves on the board of directors for the Cancer Support Community and the Kennedy-King Memorial College Scholarship Fund. She is a past member of the board of directors of the Diablo Regional Arts Association; prior to joining the DRAA board, she served as a trustee for the organization. Other boards she has served on include the Walnut Creek Library Foundation, the Contra Costa Childcare Council, New Connections and the Pleasant Hill/Martinez Soccer Association. As a volunteer soccer referee, she was twice named

Ms. Haskew received her Bachelor of Science in Accounting from Golden Gate University, summa cum laude, in 1980 and her Masters in Taxation from Golden Gate in 1986. She taught as an adjunct instructor in the Masters of Tax Program at Golden Gate University for several years, served on the Statewide Committee of Taxation for the California Society of CPAS, and drafted questions used in the national CPA exam. She practiced public accounting for a Walnut Creek firm until July 2012, and considers herself "almost retired."

Ms. Haskew was born in Staten Island, New York. She moved to California just before her senior year of high school. She is married to Walnut Creek CPA Ralph Haskew. Her son, Army Sergeant First Class Steven Dotterer, and her daughter-in-law, Army Staff Sergeant Joelyn Dotterer, are currently stationed at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio, Texas, where they live with their two children.

To quote Ms. Haskew: "My focus on Council has been to continue Walnut Creek's legacy of a safe, friendly community with a vibrant business environment and exceptional quality of life. The experience that I've gained in my four years on Council has given me an even deeper respect and appreciation for the uniquely special feeling of community and caring that sets our city apart. My theme as your mayor is WALNUT CREEK WORKS. This expression honors how all the components (city services and amenities, geographic location, for-profit and not-for-profit enterprises, and community participation and dedication) mesh together to support and enhance our common goals. I am running to City Council to dedicate another four years to using my professional strengths to keep our city fiscally strong, my optimism to guide our city into tomorrow, and my commitment to keep the best of our city's legacy for future generations."

This is an exciting time to live in Walnut Creek. In my eight years on your City Council, we have experienced a lot of change. The recession required hard work just to keep the city afloat. In my first term, we made massive budget cuts and fundamental changes to our fiscal framework, including negotiating with our employees to pay the full employee share of their pensions. That fiscal discipline has, with the improved economy, produced a nearly \$3 million surplus this year. We also focused on economic development, including approving The Orchards project. Together with the Encina Grande renovation, this has significantly upgraded the retail and dining opportunities in this area.

We modified the Shadelands Business Park zoning to provide greater flexibility to encourage new businesses to come to the Shadelands. While medical and office uses dominate, it now has the

Ultimate Fieldhouse Sports Complex, a school for the performing arts, the Calicraft Taproom, and a senior living center is coming in the near future.

The Council made these changes after a lot of public discussion, particularly on the Orchards project. I believe we will experience an improved quality of life for those of us living east of Heather Farm Park. During this busy and productive four years, we improved public safety by adding officers to our Police Department, approving the opening of an office in the Shadelands and placing a school resource officer at Northgate High School.

In approving renewal of Broadway Plaza, the downtown residential developments, and several affordable housing projects, the Council supported the goals of economic development and increased housing opportunities, particularly for those interested in a more urban lifestyle. In building the All-Abilities Playground, rebuilding Larkey Pool, and renovating the Boundary Oak Golf Course Clubhouse, the Council supported improving our parks.

In adopting the plastic bag ban and the secondhand smoke ordinance, joining Marin Clean Energy, providing subsidies for public transit, and in acquiring additional open space lands, the Council supported a healthier environment.

In the next four years, we will face some big issues, including providing more housing and more affordable housing, responding to climate change, replacing the Clarke Swim Center, continuing to repair our aging infrastructure, and addressing the currently unfunded employee pension liability.

Prepare for an Emergency

More than of Americans live in counties that have experienced a weather invated disavter. However, only of Americans have created an emergency plan for their households. While its almost impossible to predict when an emergency or natural disavter will occur, creating a plan may help keep your family safe in the event of one. The better prepared you are, the more comfortable you'll be if you have to out your plan into action.

KNOW THE RISKS

No matter where you live, your region may be susceptible to one or more emergency situations or weather hazards, including: earthquakes, wildfires, flooding, tornadoes, hurricanes or blizzards. Although some of these events like hurricanes—may provide some advanced warning, others—like earthquakes—are hard to predict. Other emergencies can happen at any time, such as a house or building fire. Common causes include faulty appliances, electrical components and smoking. In fact, cooking equipment was the cause of **45%** of home structure fires from 2009-2013.²

DECIDE ON AN EMERGENCY MEETING PLACE

Emergency situations are chaotic. In the midst of the confusion, it can be difficult to get in touch with loved ones. Decide on a meeting place with your family ahead of time to reduce some of the initial stress. Choose three locations: one in the neighborhood, one in your town and one out-of-town, and make sure everyone knows how to get there. Your safe area may vary depending on the emergency—for example, in the event of a tornado or hurricane, stay away from windows and take cover in an interior room of your home or building, on the lowest floor.

MAKE A PLAN

Make a plan that outlines all the information you'll need to know in the event of an emergency. Not only will it help you get to a safe location, it'll also allow you to let your loved ones know you're safe.

1. Create a spreadsheet that includes:

- · Names and nicknames of each family member
- Phone numbers
- Email addresses
- Names of doctors
- Places of work
 Schools
- Schools

2. Plan a safe evacuation route.

If you're home when an emergency occurs, you may have to evacuate with little to no notice. Select several safe evacuation routes, and make sure everyone is familiar with them.

3. Assign roles.

Have someone turn off the utilities, like water and electricity, while another person packs the important documents and another grabs pets. Giving everyone a responsibility will ensure nothing important is left behind.
