Friends of Walnut Creek Appeal Orchard's Approval

Woodlands resident Steve Elster, representing the group Friends of Walnut Creek, challenged the approval of the Orchard's project at the September 2 City Council Meeting. Elster argued that by reopening public comment on the project on June 17, after it was ostensibly closed on June 3, the City Council had violated the Brown Act, the California law requiring open meetings.



Elster said that the City had misinformed the public and that many from the

public would have come to speak on June 17 had they know that open public comment would be allowed. Based on this Elster said the City Council should restart the process and reconsider any approvals granted. After briefly considering the appeal the City Council denied the claim, disagreeing with the assertion that the Brown Act had been violated.

In addition to the appeal at the meeting, Friends of Walnut Creek has filed a lawsuit in Contra Costa Superior Court requesting that all construction be stopped and no further approvals for the project be given. The lawsuit states that the proposal violates the California Environmental Quality Act.

Friends of Walnut Creek is an unincorporated group comprised of Woodlands and other local residents opposed to the Orchards project as currently envisioned. In particular the group is opposed to the inclusion of a grocery store in the Orchards site plan, which it feels will force the Nob Hill grocery story in Citrus Plaza to close. Additional concerns from the group include increased traffic, the destruction of trees and other natural habitats for a variety of animals.



Safety Reminder: Garage Sale Guidelines

From an interview with Officer Mark Kan

The Woodlands Annual Garage Sale has been a positive neighborhood event for years. Let's all do our part to keep it safe & successful. The sale is widely publicized in the Contra Costa Times, Craigslist, and on signage along Oak Grove and other main streets. While this brings in shoppers from all over - not just neighbors - it also provides an opportunity for strangers to be on your property.

If your garage is open, know that anyone who visits your sale can see everything inside. Bike theft is a huge problem in Walnut Creek at this time. Be wary if someone wants to "test drive" your bicycle/s. Take precautionary measures like asking to hold the person's ID until the bike is returned. If your mail slot empties into your garage, clear out any buildup of mail to prevent identity theft.

If you are participating in the garage sale, don't leave out petty cash, your cell phone, wallet, keys or anything personal. These are easy to pocket. Keep an eye on all your sale items. Team up with family members and/or friends.

As a rule, don't allow anyone to enter your house. Keep your house & car locked. Keep in mind that anything visible in your car can be targeted for coming back to later. Even if it's just your gym bag, to someone who's looking for items, it could look appealing.

Let your neighbors know if you will be participating in the sale, especially if they are going to be out of town. Make sure that if they are out of town, any newspapers and/or mail is out of sight. PUMPKIN Decorating Contest

The Nextdoor website is a free social networking site that is created for neighbors to share anything from classified listings to crime and safety information. The dedicated Woodlands Nextdoor group can be found at https:// woodlandswalnutcreek.nextdoor.com. As of 9/14/14, there are 99 Woodlands residents signed up who are sharing information about lost-and-found pets, providing dry-cleaning and contractor recommendations, advertising free items / posting wanted ads, and providing crime and safety tips.



Once you've signed up you can send invitations to your neighbors and Woodlands friends to join, which expands the network and increases its social value. If you're a Facebook user, this website will look familiar: you post on a neighborly topic and then other Woodlands residents can either "thank" you for your posting (similar to Facebook's "Like" button) or comment on the post. Those of us who are already signed up look forward to seeing new members join. Just keep in mind that Nextdoor's "Guidelines for Neighborly Behavior" advise against using profanity, over-posting, and airing personal issues, so as much as you may want to call out your @#!&\$*!! neighbor who annoys you to no end by posting an hourly rant about the person, this is not the forum.
