

Please Drive Slowly!

As school begins and our neighborhood sees more children out and about, we ask that you please drive slowly!

Here are some facts about speeding:

- Most speeders in your neighborhood live in your neighborhood. (KKAD25)
- Speeding in residential neighborhoods represents the single greatest complaint issue to police departments and city council representatives throughout the U.S. (KKAD25)
- It is not unusual for speeders to be clocked in excess of 40 mph (and even 50 mph on occasion) in 25-mph zones. (KKAD25)
- Speeding extends the distance necessary to stop a vehicle.
 - o At 20 mph, the total stopping distance needed is 69 feet.

WATCH FOR

CHILDREN

- o At 30 mph, the distance needed is 123 feet.
- o At 40 mph, the distance needed is 189 feet which may not be enough distance and time for you to avoid hitting an object or person on the road (USDOT, NHSTA)
- ▶ If you hit a pedestrian:
 - o At 20 mph 5% will die
 - o At 30 mph 45% will die
 - o At 40 mph 85% will die (USDOT)

Drive slower for your safety and for those around you. Please help keep our neighborhood safe!

Water Conservation Tips & Services from the Contra Costa Water District

Keep Conserving in the Hot Months To Come

From the CC Water District WaterSaver E-Newsletter

Ontra Costa Water District customers have cut their water use by 17 percent! Your efforts to save today will help ensure we have enough water to meet future needs. CCWD's Drought Program for 2014 is asking for a 15 percent reduction. August and September are generally hot and dry, and that means CCWD customers must continue to save water. Please visit www. ccwater.com/conserve/ for additional information on how to conserve.

Lawn & Landscape Watering Schedule

Lawns: Water lawns 2-3 days per week in July and August. Run stations with spray heads for 4-6 minutes per cycle and two start times per watering day. For example, if you have stations with pop-up spray heads watering a lawn, set the timer to water for five minutes at 4 a.m. and at 6 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. This will result in the station watering a total of 30 minutes per week.

Shrubs: Water shrubs 2 days per week. Run spray heads for 4-6 minutes per start time and two start times per watering day. For example, if you have stations with pop-up spray heads watering a shrub bed, set the timer to water for five minutes at 4 a.m. and 6 a.m. on Tuesday and Thursday. This will result in the station watering a total of 20 minutes per week.

Maintain Your Sprinklers

Sprinkler Maintenance: Inspect each sprinkler station for broken, bent or misaligned sprinklers and repair as necessary. If replacing sprinkler heads or nozzles, always use the same brand and specific device model. This will ensure the watering is even across the lawn.

Drip Line Maintenance: Inspect drip lines for small breaks, missing emitters or other problems. Breaks in drip lines can waste a significant amount of water because we generally run our drip lines for long periods of time. If you need to replace broken drip emitters, it is best to pull out the broken emitter and replace it with a goof plug. Then install a new drip emitter a few inches away. And remember to purchase the same type of emitter as you have on the rest of the line. Repairing holes and other breaks in drip lines is fairly easy.

Report Water Waste to CCWD

Since April 1, we've received more than 200 complaints about water waste. In all but a few of them, one contact was all that was needed to get the problem solved. In those exceptions, all it took was a follow up call, and the problem was solved. If you observe obvious water waste, please call 925-688-8044 or email jfreschi@ ccwater.com and CCWD will contact the property owner.

Please have the following information when you contact us:

- Address or specific location of the water waste
- Description of water waste
- Date and time when you observed the water waste and note if this is a re-occurring event

If you believe the water waste is an immediate emergency, and it is after normal work hours, call the Districts' after hours control room at 925-688-8374.

Wasteful Watering Practices

The following uses of water supplied by the District have been determined to be wasteful and are prohibited when the 15 percent Voluntary Drought Management Program is in effect:

Single Family and Multi-Family Residential Customers:

- a. Outside watering of landscaping during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- b. Outside watering with District furnished water that results in excessive flooding or runoff into a gutter, drain, patio, driveway or street.
- c. Washing a vehicle, trailer or boat with District-furnished water using a hose without a shutoff nozzle.
- d. Washing paved or other hard-surfaced areas, including sidewalks, walkways, driveways, patios and parking areas with District-furnished water.
- e. Using District-furnished water for non-recirculating decorative fountains or filling decorative lakes or ponds.

FOOD WASTE

Spoiled foods, bones, greasy paper-your green cart is eager to gobble them all! Wrap kitchen scraps into newspaper or paper bags, or place them loose in the cart, as shown right. They will be composted, along with yard trimmings, to become rich soil amendment for farms and gardens. (Danville program coming March 2015.)

Fruit Tree Harvesting & Donations

Do you have a productive fruit tree that provides more fruit than you can eat? Consider registering it with The Urban Farmers, an East Bay volunteer-based organization that will harvest the fruit from your tree(s) and donate it to local food banks. Harvesting your fruit will also alleviate broken tree branches due to excessive weight of the fruit putting pressure on the tree and will discourage visits from pests, rodents, and insects that are attracted to fallen, rotting fruit. If you enjoy picking the fruit yourself, then The Urban Farmers will accept whatever you'd like to donate and transport it to a food bank. In addition to registering your tree, consider volunteering (a great kid-friendly activity!) and help provide hungry families in Contra Costa County with fresh, healthy, unprocessed food that is often free of pesticides. Please visit www.theurbanfarmers.org for more information and to complete online volunteer/tree registration forms.

Other ways you can use your excess fruit:

- Make "welcome" fruit baskets for new Woodlands residents
- Create fruit tree exchanges with your neighbors (e.g., trade apples for oranges)
- Make easy summertime treats such as popsicles, smoothies, and fruit-infused iced tea
- Have lemons? Show your kids/grandkids how to make lemonade and help them start a lemonade stand.
