Lanning James Bryant - Woodlands Association Past President

October 8, 1946 - November 3, 2017

Lanny Bryant, past president of the Woodlands Association, passed away in November. The Association was contacted by another past president, Jim Tilley, who brought Lanny's passing to our attention, and we asked Jim if he could share his reflection on Lanny and his service to the community:

Lanny Bryant was a unique and energetic Woodlands neighbor. When Lanny was promoted to the Bay Area and after much diligence he and Carolyn chose the Woodlands to make their home and raise their family. After volunteering for numerous neighborhood endeavors he was elected president of our Woodlands Association in the 1990s. Lanny gathered a great set of fresh board members in the late '90s and into the early 2000s. We knew that Lanny had many interests but when he was with his board he had a magnificent ability to focus on the Woodlands.

Lanny managed with calmness and conviction as well as with the gentle understanding that we were all volunteers. He was clear with his direction while always listening to the varied views of the board and more importantly to the voices of the neighbors. Every board meeting was open to all neighbors.

The board had a sincere liking for his subtle humor and chuckled often at Lanny's unexpected puns. When Lanny finally resigned his position as Woodlands President he left an excellent board and a set of processes to his successor to work with. We realized that the disciplines he established would continue and we experienced that the board functioned with nary a blip. The new president appreciated what he was able to take over. We have all lost a wonderful friend. Those of us who worked and volunteered with Lanny two decades ago all have very fond memories and felt the many results were all worth working for.

The Woodlands Association Board would like to express our condolences to the Bryant family and Lanny for his service to the community. Thanks also to Jim Tilley for sharing his memories of Lanny's time on the Board.

RECYCLE & WASTE PREVENTION

Did you know that Recycle Smart and Republic Services is the first fleet in the country, where 100% of the trucks are powered by Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) thus reducing auto emissions significantly?

A tip to reducing your trash bill: you only pay for the black trash bin. Recycling and composting are free. The smaller the black bin you use, the cheaper your service will be.

The following information will help you determine what's recycle or waste and how to handle both:

BATTERIES & LIGHT BULBS

Batteries and light bulbs are not trash. They have hazardous material in them. Please put your batteries and light bulbs in a zip lock bag and put them out curbside. Place them or tape them on top of the blue recycling cart. The driver will exit the vehicle and collect them by hand.

ELECTRONICS

It is a misdemeanor to dispose of computers, TV's, DVD players, iPhone's, etc. in your trash. It can contaminate water supplies and mess with the landfill process.

To dispose of your electronics there are two easy ways.

- 1. Please place them outside during the "Reuse" Day.
- 2. Call for a fee-based curbside pickup from Republic Services 925-685-4711

You can also drop off at Concord Recycling at 1320 Galaxy Way in Concord. A fee applies.

EXTRA CARDBOARD & YARD WASTE

Each resident is entitled to four free bulk trash pickup days per year. During that time, you can leave out additional trash, recycling and yard waste. Republic Services also has two bulk pickup days during the year (where they pick up one bulky item, i.e. chair, table), providing you with up to six times for free you can dump extra waste. To schedule one of the four pickups please call 925-685-4711.

If you have additional waste can be dropped off at Concord Recycling at 1320 Galaxy Way in Concord. A fee applies.

COMPOST

In writing this article, RecycleSmart asked us to supply more information about the composting program, now required by the State of California. The average home should be composting 40% of their household trash. The Woodlands is only averaging 12% so we need to do better. To do better, let's look at what can be composted in that green bin.

- Pizza boxes
- Napkins, paper towels
- Tissues
- All food waste
- Paper plates
- Chop Sticks, popsicle sticks
- Fish & Chicken bones
- Pumpkins
- Milk Cartons
- All yard waste

What doesn't go in: diapers, dog or cat poop or dead animals. Please put these in the black bin.


HAZARDOUS WASTE

The following items are considered hazardous material and cannot be disposed of in your normal trash. Please dispose of properly.

- Pharmaceuticals please dispose at Walnut Creek City Hall Lobby. To ensure privacy, place in a zip lock bag and recycle the plastic containers (you can also remove the labels).
- Light bulbs & batteries
- Paint the Kelly Moore Paint Store on North Main St. in Walnut Creek will take up to 5 gallons
- Oil & Anti-freeze place in an appropriate container and call Republic Services for a special pick up at 925-685-4711.
- Medical Sharps please take to the Walnut Creek Fire Station 1050 Walnut Avenue or Walnut Creek City Hall in the lobby

Mushroom Barley Soup

January signals a time to reset, and soup is a great satisfying, warming, comforting go-to meal after the decadence of the holidays. This soup is a great one to make ahead, and I think benefits by being made the day before. The barley will thicken as it sits, so you may need to add a little extra broth or water to thin it just a bit. Enjoy!



- 1 Tablespoon Extra Virgin Olive Oil 1 Tablespoon unsalted butter 1 onion, chopped 2 cloves garlic, minced 1 T tomato paste 1 pound button mushrooms, sliced thin 1 pound cremini mushrooms, sliced thin 3 carrots, peeled and cut into 1/2 inch slices (if very large cut in half *lengthwise and cut into half-moons)* 2 Bay Leaves 5 sprigs fresh thyme ½ cup barlev 8 cups vegetable broth
- 1. In a large pot add the olive oil and butter
- 2. Sauté the onion until softened and translucent
- 3. Add the garlic and cook for about 30 seconds
- 4. Add in the tomato paste and cook for about a minute
- 5. Add in sliced mushrooms and sprinkle with 1 teaspoon kosher salt. I like to put the lid on the pot to help the mushrooms soften and release their liquid. Remove the lid and cook until the liquid has evaporated and the mushrooms start to get a little golden color.
- 6. Add in the bay leaves, thyme and barley, stir to combine and add in the broth.
- 7. Bring to a simmer and cook until the barley is tender about 45 minutes.

Add freshly ground black pepper and salt to taste.




