Woodlands Board Elections are Coming

The Woodlands Board of Directors is made up of four elected and several appointed positions. As required by the by-laws, the elected positions serve two-year terms. Because of limited membership on the Woodlands Board in the past, many of these positions have been filled by appointment, as allowed by the By-Laws.



The July 2007 newsletter will include a ballot that will allow Woodlands residents to vote for two of the four elected positions – vice-president and treasurer – for two-year terms. Elections for president and secretary will be held in 2008.

All residents of the Woodlands over the age 18 are eligible for elected or appointed positions on the Woodlands Board of Directors. Interested candidates for vice president and treasurer should prepare brief (up to 200 words) statements of interest to the Woodlands Board for consideration. Statements of interest should indicate the position (vice president or treasurer) that a candidate is interested in pursuing, and describe their qualifications. Statements of interest for eligible candidates will be printed in the June 2007 newsletter. Descriptions of Board Positions

Vice President – As with most elected bodies, the duties of the Vice President include serving in the absence of the President. On the Woodlands Board, this position also has included special projects that require representation of the Woodlands to entities such as the City of Walnut Creek, Mount Diablo Unified School District, and other public and private entities that have the potential to affect the quality of the Woodlands through their actions.

Treasurer – The Treasurer keeps and maintains adequate and correct books of account showing the receipts and disbursements of the association and an account of its cash and other assets. The Treasurer also pays association bills and deposits receipts from association operations and files all required Federal and State forms for the association.

Tips to Help Kids Concentrate in Class

- * Send them to bed on time. Studies show that children and most teenagers concentrate best after about nine hours of sleep.
- * Give them space. Your kids will be better able to concentrate on homework if they have a clear, uncluttered workspace. And turn off the TV; they won't learn if they're squeezing their homework in during commercials.
- * Get them organized. The National PTA suggests helping older students organize their assignments by recording them on calendars or planners, along with due dates and dates turned in.
- * Discourage "cramming." It increases anxiety and interferes with clear thinking, according to the Department of Education. Kids do better on tests if they spread out studying over several days or weeks and can relate the information to what they already know.

For the 2nd time in the last 12 months, children in the Woodlands neighborhood sacrificed a Saturday afternoon to flag down cars at the intersection of Citrus and Dogwood Drives to raise funds for needy families across the world. Last January, it was for families who were impacted by Hurricane Katrina (\$750 was collected and donated to a relief fund), and this past January, it was simply to continue the tradition of doing something for those less fortunate than the families here in our wonderful neighborhood.

Easy Ways to Conserve Water

(NewsUSA) - Oftentimes, it takes mandatory water restrictions enacted during a drought to get consumers thinking about saving water. But using less water every day can help reduce household utility bills, lessen local municipalities' energy use and put less stress on aquifers and water tables.

Officials with World Energy Solutions (stock symbol WEGY), an energy services company based in St. Petersburg, Fla., note that using less water also helps reduce air pollution by lessening the power needs of local water plants to pump, treat, recycle and purify water.

"A community's wastewater treatment plant often consumes substantially more electricity than any of the other community-owned buildings or facilities," said Jeff Stokes, World Energy Solutions vice president.

Half of a home's total water use takes place in the bathroom. Installing water-saving showerheads will reduce gallons of water used per minute in half or more. Older showerheads use 5 to 7 gallons per minute, but new models use only 2.5 gallons.

Similarly, low-flow faucet aerators can be attached to existing faucets in the kitchen and bath to reduce flow per minute. Repair faucet leaks immediately. A slow leak can waste 20 gallons or more of water each day.

Toilets are the single biggest users of household water. Check toilets periodically for leaks; a leaky toilet can waste 200 gallons of water a day, according to the Environmental Protection Agency. A constantly running toilet is obvious, but silent leaks are more difficult to detect. To test for leaks, add a drop or two of food coloring to the tank and

wait 15 minutes for signs of color in the bowl.

Replacing a poor-fitting toilet flapper is an easy do-it-yourself project. And if you are remodeling, consider replacing outdated toilets with low-flow models, which can save 20 percent.

In the kitchen, fill your dishwasher completely before running it. But in the laundry room, take advantage of your washer's water level settings. When it comes time to replace the washing machine, consider a side-loading model, which uses a third less water than a top-loading machine.
