# Successful Community Crime Meeting Held March 7, 2011

Members of the Woodlands Community met with Police Department Chief Joel Bryden and members of Walnut Creek City government on Monday, March 7<sup>th</sup> at Valle Verde Elementary to discuss concerns about criminal activity in the neighborhood and nearby businesses. About 80 neighbors attended.

Chief Bryden introduced Sgt. Sean Conley who is the officer in charge of patrols for our sector of the city. Together they discussed recent crimes in our area, and the police efforts to apprehend those responsible. They reported that they had identified and/or arrested suspects in the business robberies that have taken place near our community in the past 6 months. They also gave statistics for recent robberies and crimes against property, which according to recent data have decreased city-wide. Our recent increase probably represents criminals targeting a specific area, so patrols have been increased to improve security.

In February, the police met with business owners in Citrus Center to discuss security for themselves and their customers. One of the measures that will be taken by the police department is to increase the visibility of the police including the posting of signs describing Business Watch, a program similar to Neighborhood Watch, to involve merchants in noticing and reporting suspicious activity to assist in protection.

Chief Bryden said that the city currently has 76 sworn officers and also uses about 37 trained volunteer civilians to assist in protecting citizens and businesses.

#### **O&A from those attending:**

1) What is being done about homeless persons in Walnut Creek? Chief Bryden described the agencies and

county task force which are called in the help. Fresh Start in Walnut Creek offers assistance and advocacy to help homeless persons. They partner with county agencies such as Project Hope and Shelter Inc. to find homes and fill basic needs. Police and county agencies work together on health and safety issues to resolve these sensitive issues. 2) Door-to-Door Solicitation is controlled by having business owners who are sending out solicitors register them with the city. Each solicitor registers with a drivers' license or other legal identification, and carries a copy of the permit to solicit. Solicitors are not required to show badges or any other identification, but you can ask to see their city permit. Neighbors should call the police if they are suspicious or harassing. They city does not have an ordinance forbidding solicitation.

3) Oversized or suspicious vehicles, trucks, trailers may be parked on a city street for 72 hours; after

## Woodlands Board Elections are Coming

The Woodlands Board of Directors is made up of four elected and several appointed positions. As required by the by-laws, the elected positions serve two-year terms. Because of limited membership on the Woodlands Board in the past, many of these positions have been filled by appointment, as allowed by the By-Laws.

The Treasurer maintains the books, makes deposits and takes care of financial concerns for the Board, among other duties. The Vice President leads the Woodlands Association when the President is unavailable and represents the organization in the community.

All residents of the Woodlands over the age 18 are eligible for elected or appointed positions on the Woodlands Board of Directors. Interested candidates for these positions should prepare brief (up to 200 words) statements of interest to the Woodlands Board for consideration. Statements of interest for eligible candidates will be printed in the June newsletter. The July 2011 newsletter will include a ballot that will allow Woodlands residents to vote for Treasurer and Vice President for a two-year term. that they can be reported to traffic control and will be cited and may be towed.

4) Addressing felony drug activity in 2008-09, Chief Byden said that Walnut Creek has a reputation among criminals that Walnut Creek is not a good place to buy and sell drugs because of the work of the police to pursue and arrest those committing such crimes. He cautioned that robberies are usually crimes of opportunity committed by those needing money to support a drug habit. Work is being done in the high schools to educate students about the dangers of becoming involved in drugs, and he said that such a program will be given next month at Northgate High School.

#### **Safety Tips from the WCPD**

Some of the things we can do to improve our own security are to notify the police when we will be away from our homes for more than a day. Vacation security can be done by making it appear that someone is home, setting lights radios to turn on and off, and having a trusted neighbor or friend to regularly check the house inside and out. The police will also do welfare checks when you're on vacation or if you're concerned about a neighbor.

Additional tips included - don't let newspapers and mail pile up on the driveway or walkways. Always lock cars and take your keys with you. Don't leave any items of value (i.e. phones, cameras, or brief cases) on the seats or visible. Unlocked doors and vehicles present "crimes of opportunity" to those walking thru the neighborhood.

Neighborhood Watch programs have shown to decrease criminal activity in residential areas. Mayor Cindy Silva said her neighborhood has had this program for 25 years, and found it to be an effective deterrent to crime. The police indicated that a neighborhood watch is one of the most effective crime deterrents. 


