Woodlands Resident Elected To City Council

Three Walnut Creek City Council seats were up for grabs in the November 6th election. Five candidates were on the ballot and four were actively campaigning. Bob Simmons, incumbent and current mayor, placed first with 18,115 votes. Loella Haskew, a retired CPA, placed second with 15,952 votes. Placing third with 13,533 votes was Justin Wedel, a Woodlands resident and small business owner. Justin is the current President of the Woodlands Association. He ran on a platform that emphasized fiscal responsibility, community driven development, and public safety. Justin was endorsed by the Walnut Creek Chamber of Commerce, Police Officer's Association, and the Contra Costa Times. The Association looks forward to working with Justin and the rest of the City Council on important neighborhood issues.

Holiday Lights in the Woodlands – Toys for Tots Drive By Deanna Constable

It's that time of year again when our neighborhood will be decked out in festive holiday lights and decorations. With extensive lights, creativity, and enchanting decorations, two particular homes in the Woodlands have become yearly holiday favorites: 524 Candleberry Road and 3265 Primrose Lane. This is nothing new – these homes have been putting up their detailed holiday scenes for roughly 30 and 22 years, respectively.

When I met with the homeowners, both said that they started slowly and grew the scope of the decorations through the years. Carolyn Hiland shared that when her youngest daughter, now a teacher at Valley Verde Elementary, was a child they noticed how much she enjoyed looking at the lights. A friend of the family had given them a playhouse with teddy bears, which they promptly put holiday lights on, and it grew from there. Inspired by the Hiland's Candleberry holiday lights, Matt said that his Primrose Lane household started their tradition from a love of the season and inspiration from the happy faces of children and Rossmoor residents who come to see the decorations. Both homeowners invest time and money to put the decorations up and then carefully take them down and store them for the next year. Matt shared that more and more, they are switching to LED lights. These use about 1/3 less energy and continue to work even if one or several lights are burned out.

The Hiland's 524 Candleberry Road home will continue their tradition of having a "Toys for Tots" donation area until a few days before Christmas. Bring new, unopened and unwrapped toys to donate. Pre-Teen and Teen age-appropriate gifts are especially sought.

Measure Q Failed, Up To 10 Fire **Stations May Close**

A measure to impose an additional \$75 parcel tax to maintain current levels of fire services in parts of Contra Costa County failed to reach the necessary 2/3 majority. 52.6% of the electorate supported the measure while 47.4% opposed. This was the second time the electorate has turned down tax increases to maintain fire services in Contra Costa County.

The Firefighters Union strongly supported the measure while critics maintained that this was a short-term fix to a long-term pension liability problem. Retirement costs make up 25% of the District's current budget. As a result of the measure failing, up to 10 of 28 fire stations may be closed. Stations in Concord, Martinez, Lafayette, and Pittsburg are likely on the list. The Association will monitor the situation and inform our residents on any service changes in our area.
