Neighborhood Meeting to Discuss Shadelands Gateway Specific Plan - February 8, 2012

In May 2011, Property Development Centers, a Safeway company, as the owner of the 25 acres located on the northwest corner of Ygnacio Valley Road and Oak Grove Road submitted a Pre-Application request for the City Council to consider an amendment of the existing General Plan land use designation from Business Park to General Retail. On August 2, 2011, the City Council endorsed the idea of processing a General Plan Amendment through the creation of the Shadelands Gateway Specific Plan. The Council authorized the creation of an Advisory Committee (AC) comprised of city officials, business leaders and residents. The purpose of the AC is to develop the Shadelands Gateway Specific Plan for the property and make a recommendation to the City Council.

In addition to the AC meetings which are held once a month (see article in this months issue for dates/times), Property Development Centers is hosting a community meeting on February 8, 2012 at 7:00 pm in the existing office building located on the site. We invite all members of the Walnut Creek community to attend. The purpose of the meeting is to update the community on the progress of the AC and to listen to your comments regarding the future development of the site. Property Development Centers will take the feedback from this meeting and share the information at the AC meeting being held on February 22.

Good Neighbor Tips

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
