Safeway is Requesting the City to Consider Retail in the Shadelands

Fellow board member Joe Casey and I were invited to a meeting with two employees of Property Development Centers (a Safeway subsidiary) and a Safeway consultant on May 31st to discuss the 24+ acre Shadelands Business Park parcel (owned by Safeway) located at the corner of Oak Grove Rd. and Ygnacio Valley Rd. The purpose of the meeting was to obtain an understanding of the community's thoughts on development of the parcel. We appreciate their efforts and see this as a good sign that they took the time to reach out to the community at an early stage of the process.

The proposed project includes relocating the Encina Grande Safeway to a new 55k sq. ft. store that would anchor a retail redevelopment of their Shadelands property, amongst other shopping possibilities. However, the current zoning regulations do not allow retail of this nature and an amendment to the General Plan would be necessary for this project to move forward.

Deb Karbo, Director of Development for Property Development Centers, submitted the following information for the newsletter:

"Safeway has submitted an application to the City of Walnut Creek seeking a General Plan Amendment for its 25 acre parcel located on the northwest corner of Ygnacio Valley Road and Oak Grove Road. The application simply requests the Council grant authorization for Safeway to study alternative retail/commercial uses on the parcel. If the Council agrees to the study, it by no means grants approval for any type of development. Rather, it allows Safeway the opportunity to begin the process of working collaboratively with the neighborhood to solicit input and to formulate a plan that would ultimately lead to a formal development application. The only firm plan Safeway has for the site is to relocate their existing store from across the street. What else is built on the remainder of the site will be determined by Safeway working in conjunction with the neighborhood and the City. This will be a thoughtful, comprehensive process with many community meetings and many public hearings. In addition, there will be a thorough analysis of all aspects of the project from environmental issues to traffic impacts to project design. Safeway's goal would be to build a project that enhances the neighborhood. The hearing for the General Plan Amendment request is set for August 2, 2011, 7 p.m. in the Council Chamber at City Hall, 1666 North Main Street."

MEASURE C UPDATE FOR NORTHGATE HS:

Moving Forward with Facilities Improvements

The Mt. Diablo Unified School District approved \$1.5 million in funding from Measure C bonds to immediately be dispersed for a series of facilities enhancement projects at Northgate High School.

In a concerted effort, The Northgate Community Pride Foundation (NCPF), the school district, Northgate High School and the Northgate PFC, are all working as partners to ensure the approved funds from the Measure C bond initiatives are best allocated to serve the school and the students. These organizations have prioritized facilities improvement projects including matching funds for completion of the Northgate High School sports complex with the installation of permanent bleachers. Other projects listed include converting the auto shop into a new engineering facility, construction of new classrooms, renovation of bathrooms, and restoration of the girls locker room. NCPF will continue to fund raise with fresh campaigns for each new project.

"Assisting with the installation of permanent bleachers is the top priority as the Northgate Pride Foundation has already raised \$2.25 million of the total \$2.75 million needed to build the sports complex that has been in the works for over six years," said Kassie Wenzell, president of NCPF. "This project is shovel-ready, has all the necessary district approvals for design and construction and is in position for installation in 2011. The Northgate Athletic Boosters capped bleacher fundraising with a generous \$50,000 donation to reach our goal."

The list and prioritization improvements were made in conjunction with the 2011 Northgate High School strategic plan set forth by the high school and the Northgate PFC.






