On a sunny spring day, May 8, families gathered at the Woodlands Cabana Club to observe the annual Pancake Breakfast. While a couple of parents cooked delicious pancakes, others welcomed neighbors, dished out pancakes, fruit, juice and coffee.

For some neighbors it was a first look at the refurbished pools and deck which were recently completed. The diving pool has a new diving board, one instead of two, so swimmers can dive from the edge of the pool into the deep water, instead of the shallow end of the pool, according to Polly Bradbury, Fund Raising Chair. Besides resurfacing the pool, a new tile edge was added to replace the deteriorating one. The baby pool was also resurfaced, and some concrete areas which were raised from tree roots were replaced. Additional concrete pads were added near the diving pool. The overall effect is a much safer and more enjoyable facility for our families and children to enjoy their swimming.






