Bayberry Pond Update By Lesley Hunt, WC Open Space Foundation

The biggest news at Bayberry Pond is the mallard family, as many of you are already aware. At this writing, twelve ducklings survive and they are growing fast. This represents real progress for us – in three years, the pond environment has grown rich enough to support a mallard family. I understand that the nest was somewhere in the neighborhood. Last summer we lost many trees to girdling by the record crop of rodents. This winter we replanted and will take greater measures to protect the seedlings. Our planned objective was to increase the number of shrubs in the chaparral areas. We planted nearly a hundred, including a new patch of roses on the far side of the pond. Some of the older shrubs are big enough to bloom. This will increase the variety and timing of blooms and bring us closer to providing a steady food supply for the

The bad news is that we've discovered a number of erosion problems, starting with the drains from Ygnacio Valley Road and continuing down the stream bed and into the pond. The concrete that used to prevent erosion in the outlet channel has been disarranged by storms and must be repaired. City staff will be working on this during the summer, time permitting.

Because the outlet repairs will require equipment to be brought in, we canceled our plans to plant grass in this area. We did plant in another area with indifferent results. We tried a new method and are evaluating whether it or the dry weather in January is responsible for the poor outcome.

THE IMPORTANCE OF COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAMS (CERT). GET WITH THE PROGRAM!

The recent events in Japan should remind us that we also live on shaky ground and should be prepared.

Fortunately there is a program designed to help local people prepare for local emergencies. CERT (COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAMS) is part of a nation-wide program that teaches people the skills they need to pull together and safely help their community in the event of disaster, since the demand for emergency services will likely exceed available resources.

The local CERT program is run by the City of Walnut Creek. Trainees go through a basic 20-hour training program, and are sworn in as volunteer Disaster Service Workers for the City of Walnut Creek. The goal is to have trained volun-



teer teams in all nine of the CERT Areas identified in Walnut Creek, with emergency supplies stored around the City. Those who have taken the course are invited to attend monthly update meetings, usually held at the Ygnacio Valley branch of the Walnut Creek Public Library (2661 Oak Grove Road). HOW CERT WORKS IN WALNUT CREEK

Trainees are assigned to an area based on where they live. In the event of emergency, CERTs gather at their Staging Area and work together as trained in the Program. Every block in the city should gave at least one CERT trained person, or more.


Woodlands Neighborhood 4th of July Parade and Party is on! By Nancy Holian






