The Woodlands:

Walnut Creek's First "Disaster Wise Neighborhood"

The November pipeline explosion in downtown Walnut Creek was a reminder that emergencies can happen anywhere, at any time. In the event of a major catastrophe, such as an earthquake, experts say that residents are likely to be on their own for the first 72 hours.

To help citizens prepare for such an event, the City of Walnut Creek is launching the "Disaster Wise Neighborhoods" program and is inviting Woodlands residents to be the first to participate with a special presentation at 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 23 at Valle Verde Elementary School.

"Disaster Wise Neighborhoods" is actually a three-phase program that gives people the know-how to take care of themselves, their families and their neighbors in the event of a disaster. Residents are encouraged to take part in all three phases, although each stands alone.

Phase One is an hour-long Disaster Preparedness presentation by the Con-

tra Costa Fire Department and the City of Walnut Creek, featuring the Red Cross video "Earthquake! Do Something!," hands-on lessons in turning off utilities, information on creating Disaster Survival Kits and details on Community Emergency Response Team training.

The Disaster Preparedness Presenta-

tion will be from 7-8 p.m. Wednesday, March 23 at Valle Verde Elementary School, 3275 Peachwillow Lane.

Phase Two is the 20-hour "Community Emergency Response Team" training. Through CERT, you will learn how to extinguish small fires, perform light search and rescue, treat life-threatening conditions, and create a Neighborhood CERT team.

Finally, Phase Three is a citywide Emergency Preparedness Fair, to be held Sept. 11 at Civic Park. Look for more information on this informative event as it draws nearer!

say costs that exceed revenues must be cut somewhere. Mount Diablo Unified School District is still assessing where to cut back based on local and state funding shortfalls. The actual cutback target is about \$4 million across the district for the following school year. The district must have its plan in place by the end of March 2005. At the most recent board meetings, neighbors, teachers and students alike were clearly being

The February 8th school district board meeting had an incredible standing-room-only turnout and resulted in the district taking both Northgate's upper level foreign language courses and 5th grade music at Valle Verde off the district's cut list. Valle Verde's fourth grade music program is still under consideration.

At this newsletter deadline, items still included on the cut list are librarians, nurses and even one

of the shared psychologists in the district. It is clear that having your voices heard by the actual decision makers on the board continues to be extremely important and makes a real difference in their priorities.

High School Exit Exam Becomes a Reality

You probably all recall that we passed a state law in 1999 that all public high school students must pass an exit exam to graduate with a diploma. It has now become a reality for all our students that are scheduled to graduate after this year. The requirement was waived for the class of 2005 but the school district has just sent a letter out to high school and middle school

parents that the exit exam will not be waived for students graduating from Northgate after 2005.

The high school exit exam covers both English-language arts and Mathematics. The English part includes California standards through grade ten and the Mathematics part includes California standards through grade seven plus Algebra I. Of course students planning to enter college or university will need to meet additional requirements.

Students will normally take the High School Exit Exam in the spring of their tenth grade year. If a student does not pass any of the individual parts of the exam, they will have up to five opportunities to retake those parts not passed earlier. Parents and guardians

should review the standards required for English and Mathematics. To help your student achieve these standards... Encourage reading and review your student's writing skills... Always expect homework to be completed... Enroll in Algebra by the eighth grade... Actively review your student's progress with their teachers... and the like.


As I wrote in my first note to you back in October, our board continues to seek your ideas and opinions on what is important to you to help guide what we do. We continue to look forward to making a difference.


