## Watchful Eye

For the past year we have printed various articles about enhancing preparedness in our neighborhood for emergencies and disasters. You've heard about programs to make ourselves more prepared and seen articles about crime watch and city-sponsored neighborhood watch programs. The purpose of this article is to encourage Woodlands residents to increase safety in and around their homes.

Although this article is not intended to alarm you, we want to inform you that during the past year burglaries and crimes associated with burglary and robbery have increased in Walnut Creek. The Woodlands neighborhood is no exception. During the first 45 days of 2006 there were 10 incidents of burglary in the Woodlands. These incidents involved several homes, car break-ins, and a Valle Verde school break-in. At the time of this writing, the most recent automobile theft (in which an automobile was actually stolen) in the Woodlands was on February 13<sup>th</sup>.

Just think about your own situation for a moment. If you locked yourself out of your house, how would you get back in? Most of us know what we would do, and we probably don't need to call any locksmith for help. Some of us leave a window unlocked. Perhaps you leave a key hidden in a fake stone in the garden, a spare key in the electric box or inside the pool timer. How about under the door mat or in the blue flower pot?

If you can into your house with

relative ease, certainly a burglar can do the same. The Walnut Creek Police Department informed us that roughly one out of ten homes will be burglarized in the bay area during 2006. You can easily have your Woodlands home more secure and reduce the chances of being one of the "one

d

in ten" victims. Burglars do not spend much time trying to break in, so locked doors, windows and good neighbors watching out for each other – are excellent deterrents.

Our police department also said that over half of all successful home burglaries are because of unlocked doors and windows. Sliding glass doors are easy to get through even when locked. You can secure them by installing better locks or by placing a broomstick or dowel in the inside track to jam the door from being pried open. Instead of hiding keys around the outside of your home, have a neighbor keep an extra key. Locking doors is doubly true for our vehicles. Don't ever leave your keys inside the car; not even for ten minutes while running back in the house to get something. Close and lock your car when you get out and don't ever leave the garage door opener in the car.

In the past year or so, two Woodlands homes were entered by thieves who kicked in the side garage door and then broke the door that leads from inside the garage into the house. In both cases these Woodlands residents were vacationing. Our homes were built with simple exterior doors; especially doors located on the sides of our garages. Most are relatively out of sight from the street and some are still original doors. These doors need to be reinforced both around the lockset and on the wooden door panels. You should also bar that door when you travel as well. Keep in mind that burglars don't like to

#### shatter glass because of the alarming sound, but most will not hesitate to kick wooden doors to get inside.

When you are not home, don't forget to leave the light burning by the side garage door. Many Woodlands residents have installed motion sensing switches that turn on the lights when someone approaches. These are simple devices screwed into the light socket that hold the bulb to be turned on. It's common knowledge that thieves prefer to work in the dark, so when you aren't home keep your back lights on as well. It at all possible, keep shrubbery from hiding doors or windows. Timers for lights inside the house are also guite effective and far better than leaving a light inside burning 24 hours a day when you are away. It's also a good idea to ask a neighbor to collect your mail and newspaper so that it's not "obvious" to burglars that you are away.

If you notice unfamiliar people in the neighborhood, don't hesitate to call a neighbor to check them out or even call the police. For any individual in question that truly has legitimate reasons to be in the neighborhood, no harm is done.

Our Woodlands Association is encouraging residents to initiate *neighborhood watch* groups. A *neighborhood watch* group is easy to start and has proven to be exceptionally effective in all types of communities. We have several groups already established in the Woodlands. Danielle Walrath is the Crime Prevention Coordinator for our Walnut Creek Police Department and she is ready to help you start a *neighborhood watch* group for your block. Please call Danielle at 943-5885 and she will provide you with the information necessary to get started. Danielle is ready to increase the number of "watchful eyes" in the Woodlands so we may all have safer homes.

#### **MDUSD Awards Contract** For New Classrooms **At Northgate**

During January, the Mount Diablo Unified School District approved funding for construction of two new permanent classrooms at Northgate High School. The District had originally planned to install one classroom, but a contribution by the Woodlands Association combined with other District funds made a second classroom possible. The Woodlands Association provided \$160,000 to the District in January and the construction contract was awarded. The new classrooms are scheduled for installation this summer to be ready for next school year.

Along with the \$160,000 contribution to Northgate, the Woodlands Association has also given \$40,000 to Foothill for technology improvements, which leaves \$25,000 remaining in the Woodlands Association's Citrus Walk fund - and it is planned for use on Valle Verde's improvements. By Bill Swanson

## SCHOOL BOUNDARY STUDY CANCELLED

The Mt. Diablo Unified School District Board of Education cancelled the high school capacity study at the January 3, 2006 board meeting. The study would have considered changing the geographic boundaries for attendance at District high schools. The Board still wants information on the impact of the Crystal Ranch residential development on Northgate High, on the overcrowding at College Park, as well as issues involving the Bay Point community and Mt. Diablo High. The Superintendent recommended that the study be cancelled because of declining district-wide enrollment. Board member Mayo will work with the Superintendent to bring these issues back to the Board in the future.

It appears that retaining the existing boundaries is the outcome of this decision. We will continue to monitor the situation to see if anything changes that would affect the Woodlands residents.
