

Free Emergency Response Training Offered - CERT

Don't be a helpless victim! Learn how to help yourself and your neighbors in the event of a disaster through Community Emergency Response Team training. The free six-week course includes lessons on suppressing small fires, shutting off utilities, light search and rescue, disaster First Aid, and CERT team organization. Graduates are assigned to a CERT Area. If a disaster strikes, CERT team members are encouraged to check on their own families and home first, and then assemble at a pre-designated site to work together to respond to the needs of the community. The next series for Walnut Creek residents will be held Wednesday evenings, April 18 – May 16, with a final exercise on Tuesday, May 22. Other sessions begin July 24 and Sept. 19. All classes take place from 6 - 9:30 p.m.
