The Longest Girls Basketball Season EVER, in the History of the School

The Northgate Varsity Girls basketball team did something never done before in the History of the school. They played to the quarterfinals of the Northern California State Basketball Championships. This team made the Elite Eight in California Division II (divisions are based on school size). Northgate, led by senior Courtney Hamilton, used their five guard attack into the playoffs and had an outstanding season with a 27-5 record. They won the Sonoma tournament with Courtney as MVP, the Walnut Creek Classic with Courtney as MVP, and placed in the West Coast Jamboree with Courtney all Tournament, during their preseason games. The team went on to be 12-0 and the Champions of the DVAL league. During the league season they blew away Fairfield at the Campolindo Shootout as Jr guard Kayla Galanter hit 11 3's and scored 39 points in the game.

At the end of the season, Courtney Hamilton was named All League MVP and Kayla Galanter, Tess Soper, and Greer Kleber were on the First Team All League team. Emily Jing was placed on the Second Team.

Getting a great seed due to the win over Miramonte and a close game with Dougherty Valley, they played Winsor in the first North Coast Section. After winning, they beat Dublin and went to the NCS Finals against Carondelet. The team finished second and qualified to play in the Nor Cal Tournament.

The first game was with Pleasant Valley of Chico and then they went on to beat Vallejo at Vallejo. This was the furthest a team had gone in the Nor Cal tournament. They lost to Archbishop Mitty of San Jose who then played Carondelet for the Nor Cal Championship.

It was a great season and next year brings 9 of the 11 girls back for continued on page 4

This Year at Bayberry Pond

Once again the frogs and toads have produced lots of tadpoles in the pond, and this year we have more underwater grass and rushes to provide cover and help them survive. We extended the row of willows down to the dam and planted a cottonwood in that corner. Ranger Art Janke found the perfect dead tree for a turtle log and installed it in the pond last fall. We're hoping to have western pond turtles but we haven't seen any yet.

Other wildlife is arriving, though. A pair of mallard ducks found plenty of food one morning this winter. They still didn't set up housekeeping, but conditions had obviously improved for them. Maybe next year. Another morning a great egret visited. A great horned owl spent an hour on one of the raptor poles at Thanksgiving. And we have seen three species of nonpoisonous snakes.

Last winter's plantings had a better survival rate than we expected. We had to weed the grass again this winter and we are still battling mustard and thistles, but the grass is thriving and the various trees and shrubs have all grown. This winter we planted a new area of grass adjacent to last year's, started a chaparral area next to that, and put a lot of shrubs on the back of the dam to create a second chaparral area. We also created a grove of trees below the enclosure. Some of the flower seeds we planted on the dam last year did well, other species did not. Our effort to plant different flowers from seeds this winter was not successful. Overall, though, we are satisfied with our progress.

We hope you are enjoying the pond and the wildlife when you walk in the Open Space.

- Never go to playgrounds or movies **alone**. Always bring a friend.

- Never hitch-hike.
- Stay away from isolated areas or abandoned buildings.
- If you see someone unusual hanging around a schoolyard or a park, tell your parents.
