## Neighborhood Watch Program Can Help Protect Our Community By Elsie Witt

Anyone whose home has been burglarized often feels one of many emotions including shock, helplessness and anger. Burglary is generally considered a crime against property. This crime carries the added potential for injury or death to the victim who comes into surprise contact with the intruder. Some of our residents have been victims of burglars, and asked the Woodlands Association Board what can be done to deter such crimes.

The Walnut Creek police have advised us that one of the best deterrents is neighbors looking out for one another. In the past Neighborhood Watch Programs have been formed in our area to address this crime and others that we as private citizens can be proactive in preventing.

The Walnut Creek Police Department sponsors the **Neighborhood Watch Program.** This program offers a way to get citizens involved and proactive in protecting their homes, according to Amy Doyle, Walnut Creek Police Department. Some of the areas the program focuses on are helping citizens recognize suspicious activity, persons, and vehicles. The program also encourages neighbors get to know each other, exchange phone numbers in case of emergency, and become generally aware of each other's comings and goings. This is an easy way to prevent crime. When your neighbors are aware that you are away or notice strangers in the area, the police should be alerted.

The National Sheriffs' Association created the National Neighborhood Watch Program in 1972, with financial assistance from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, to unite law enforcement agencies, private organizations, and individual citizens in a massive effort to reduce residential crime. The plan which emerged put together local neighborhoodbased programs.

Since its establishment Neighborhood Watch has helped thousands of local residents to 1) make their own homes and families less inviting targets for crime, and 2) cooperate with law enforcement through block and neighborhood groups to control crime throughout their community.

Statistics show that when a concerned citizenry does its part, the possibilities are endless, and the results are positive. One of the reasons we began publishing the "Crime Watch" in our Woodlands Newsletter, is to help us know what crimes are happening here, and to take steps to decrease the chances of becoming a victim.

Burglary, unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft, is the crime that is targeted particularly by **Neighborhood Watch**, and is one major crime that can be effectively resisted by each citizen taking positive action at home. Some of the things we as citizens can do include:

- Arrange for home security inspections by crime prevention officers to identify security vulnerabilities,
- Upgrade locks, security hardware and lighting,
- Train family members to lock doors and windows when leaving home,
- Ask neighbors to watch for suspicious activity when the house is vacant,
- Organize block parent and block WATCH groups to assist children, the elderly, and other especially vulnerable persons if they appear to be distressed, in danger or lost,
- Meet in neighborhood groups with trained crime prevention officers to discuss needs and crime prevention strategies,
- Identify the area's participation with decals warning, "Neighborhood Watch—our neighbors are watching to report suspicious activity to our law enforcement agency."



Below is one of our favorite Fall recipes for your feast...

**Orange Glazed Cranberry Pumpkin Bread** 

3 1/2 cups flour 1 2/3 cups sugar 2 teaspoons baking soda 3/4 teaspoon salt 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

1 (16oz) can pumpkin 1 (16oz) can whole berry cranberry sauce 3/4 cup chopped pecans, toasted 4 eggs

In a large bowl, mix together ingredients in first column. In a second bowl, stir together ingredients in second column. Add pumpkin mixture to flour mixture; stir until ingredients are just moistened. Pour batter into two greased 9x5-inch loaf pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 65 minutes or until breads test done with wooden pick. Cool in pans 10 minutes then remove to cooling racks; let cool completely.

*Glaze:* In a small bowl, mix 1 cup powdered sugar, 1/4 cup undiluted orange juice concentrate & 1/8 teaspoon ground allspice. Drizzle glaze over top and sides of breads.
