McDonald's Update

Keeping You Informed For Over 40 Years

The Woodlands Board was very pleased with the turnout at the community meeting at the Woodlands Cabana last month. Over 130 residents showed up to hear from city officials and to express their opinions about the proposed McDonald's fast-food establishment at the entrance to the Woodlands neighborhood. Our special thanks go to the members of the Walnut Creek Community Development Department who attended - Jeremy Lochirco, Victoria Walker, and Sandra Meyer. A number of important issues were discussed - the upcoming traffic study and intersections that would be analyzed, parking concerns, noise, odor, the arbor that would be impacted by the development, hours of operation, and the role of the Planning Department. More than 25 residents asked questions, and the general feeling is that residents came away with a better understanding of the proposed project, how the process is vetted by city officials, and how best to stay informed of developments.

November 2010

As of the writing of this article in mid-October, there are just a few updates on the McDonald's fast-food project at the corner of Oak Grove Road and Citrus Drive. The Board was recently informed by Senior Planner Jeremy Lochirco that the City of Walnut Creek has just received funding from McDonald's to begin the important traffic impact study. Due to the delay, there is a high likelihood that the Planning Commission meeting will be pushed back from the previously scheduled November 18 to December 9. The Board agrees with the Planning Department that it is best to have the traffic study completed so the Commission can share these important results with our community.

Jeremy further informed the Board that McDonald's has not submitted any revised plans, nor a timeline for when those plans will be resubmitted. The McDonald's application remains incomplete, and no formal action by the Commission can take place until the application is complete.

Furthermore, though the Board previously informed McDonald's that the Woodlands monthly newsletter would be the best and broadest way to inform the community as to if and/or when they would like to schedule a public meeting, no communications have come from any McDonald's representatives since early September.

Woodlands Cabana Club Named Best Pool in Walnut Creek!

Now, the entire Walnut Creek Community will know what Woodlands residents have known for years: the Woodlands Cabana Club is the Best Pool Club in Walnut Creek.

Earlier this week, WCC board members were contacted by representatives from *Walnut Creek Magazine*, announcing that the pool had won the honor in the magazine's Best of Walnut Creek voting. Results will be published in its November issue.

Of course, the more than 200 residents who belong to the club – and our guests – know that it is a lot more than a place to swim; it is a de facto community plaza, the heart of the neighborhood and the location for school, scouting and social events throughout the summer months. It hosts the annual neighborhood 4th of July celebration, and is frequently used for philanthropic events – like TAPS swim lessons for homeless children.

The Cabana Club is also the home of wildly successful Woodlands Swim Team, known throughout the county not only for its deep level of talent, but for its sportsmanship and commitment to excellence for ALL its swimmers. In fact, the WST is currently hosting its first ever fall swimming clinic.

The pool has hosted many former and future Olympians, including Mark Spitz and Laura Davis. Several alumni have gone on to Olympic trials and junior Olympics, including Andrew Lardiere, Stephen Woods, Sara Delay and Matt Williams.

But despite its illustrious athletic legacy, the Woodlands Cabana is first and foremost a community hub – and has been for nearly half a century. The first pool was built in the early 1960s, with the second pool in the early 1970s. Several generations of Woodlands residents have used the pool, and still hang out on warm summer afternoons.



Woodlands Residents Help Local Boy Scouts for Haiti Relief

The Woodlands neighbors around Banyan Circle helped local Boy Scouts provide aid for victims of the devastating earthquake earlier this year in Haiti. Working with the charitable organization Soles4Souls and Sports Chalet Stores, Scouts from Troop 227 in Walnut Creek organized a mini-shoe drive. Led by scout Leo Brajkovich III with help from scout Alex O'Connor as part of a star rank service project, the scouts collected over 300 pairs of "gentlyused" shoes from households in the Banyan Circle portion of our neighborhood and took them to Sports Chalet in Concord. Sports Chalet is serving as the collection point for Soles4Souls. According to Sports Chalet and Soles4Souls, the broader initiative has collected nearly 1 million shoes for Haiti earthquake relief.
