CRIME PREVENTION

The California State Legislature, has so much power and influence that overshadow our local school board decisions. The school finance bill, SB 1750, was defeated in the August Legislature.

It is imperative that we send to Sacramento the best representative who will find a stable, adequate source of income for our schools next year.
