



Remember When...

Citrus was the shortcut to Treat?

A couple of decades ago, you could not take Citrus Avenue from Oak Grove Road all the way to Treat Boulevard. Citrus did not cross the canal between Walnut Creek and Concord! Finally, the bridge that we drive across on a daily basis without further thought was finished. This bridge opened the gateway for Citrus Avenue to continue into Concord. For the children that had to cross the street going to and from Valle Verde, Citrus became a dangerous place. Drivers looking to save a minute or two were speeding on Citrus every day using it as a short cut between Oak Grove and Treat.

While the city was slowly pondering this problem, our Woodlands residents knew something had to be done right away. A small group of parents seized on a genius idea. Every morning selected mothers would take their car to each end of Citrus and proceed to drive exactly 25 miles per hour back and forth until school started. They paced the traffic at the speed limit much to the chagrin of anxious and sometimes angry commuters. This was both humorous and delightfully effective. The mothers asked me not to mention their names in the newsletter, however, they laughed while telling the story.

The city and police received several complaints about slow-driving cars on Citrus (these moms were doing a great job!). In the end, the city was pressured to kill the Citrus shortcut. At that point, the "No Right on Treat from Citrus" was implemented, diverting the shortcut seekers back to Oak Grove.

As Woodlands residents, we need to remind everyone to keep their speed under 25 at all times on both Citrus and Peachwillow. Our precious children are present. Let's keep them safe.

Supporting our troops by sending packages of goodies and love from home is Crane's passion. Over the years, she's sent hundreds of packages to family members and friends in the military.

But for the uninitiated, sending packages to the troops isn't easy. There are security concerns, Crane said, and "miles of rules and regulations and rolls of red tape," which Treats for Troops takes care of so the sender doesn't have to.

For Halloween, the company is offering a Halloween Party Pack with lots of candy and treats. There's also a Halloween Grab Bag - a colorful Jack O' Lantern drawstring bag that's over a foot high and stuffed with candy, cookies and spooky monster masks -

as well as Junior Grab Bags and Big Bags including phone cards.

People who don't have family members or friends serving in the military can send packages filled with treats to a soldier, or group of soldiers, through Treats for Troops' Foster-A-Soldier program.

In addition to themed packages of goodies, Treats for Troops' online store includes many of the basic necessities that people serving overseas appreciate. There are comfortable socks that keep the feet dry, insect repellent, bungee cords, packages of batteries and ziplock bags that protect everything from snacks to socks. Of course, the store also offers every soldier's favorite: freshly baked chocolate chip cookies.

While a holiday is a good time to send a package, Crane thinks the gift-giving should

continue all year long. "Sending a package lets the troops know they're not forgotten," she said.

Quick German Carrot Salad
