Re-Cap of Woodlands Association Accomplishments Related to Citrus Walk

At the request of several interested neighbors, we are providing a recap of all accomplishments by the Woodlands Association related to the Citrus Walk Project.

Walnut Creek General Plan Update

The City of Walnut Creek held two community workshops on August 9th and August 13th to discuss the Draft General Plan and Environmental Impact Report (EIR). The purpose of the workshops was to inform the public about the contents of the drafts and to take public comments.

At the meeting some of the major themes of the General Plan were discussed. These themes included:

- Planning to reduce the number of single occupancy vehicles
- An emphasis on housing availability and higher densities in the downtown area and near transit, and
- ◆ Strategic economic stability for WC

Several members of the audience said they were concerned about the potential increases in residential, commercial and mixed-use developments. They were also concerned about increasing traffic and the need for improved public transportation. Several people also felt that their voice was not being heard and that the community feedback process was not working based on the draft General Plan. Representatives from the City said these comments, along with many others will be forwarded to the Planning Commission and the City

The draft General Plan and EIR were published August 8, 2005. The publishing of these documents starts the 45 day public comment period. All submitted written comments on the EIR will become part of the finalized EIR and must be responded to in writing by the City. We encourage inter-

ested Woodlands residents to attend upcoming meetings on this topic.

Woodlands Crime & Safety Bulletin

Back to School

Vacations are over, kid's are back in school and Fall is just around the corner. Here are just a couple safety tips for Back to School season:

- * Drive slowly in residential neighborhoods, the kids are back in school and will be walking and riding their bikes on the streets and sidewalks. Also, be aware that our traffic department (Motorcycle & Patrol Officers) will be out in force making sure everyone is obeying the rules of the road and staying safe.
- * If your child will be riding a bike, make sure he/she wears their helmet, is aware of bicycle safety and the rules.
- * Motorized scooter reminder: You must be 16 years of age, wear a helmet, and have a drivers license or learners permit. You must only travel on streets which have a speed limit of 25 mph or less or travel in separate bike lanes. Motorized scooters may not be driven over 15 mph and may not ride on sidewalks. In WC you cannot ride motorized scooters in parks, the Iron Horse Trail or the Canal trails.

Property Crimes

Property crimes are on the rise in our City, County and State. Here are a couple of helpful reminders to keep your property safe:

- * Do not keep valuables in your vehicle. It is very tempting to leave your purse, briefcase, etc. in your back seat while you "run in" for "just a sec." But that is just what the crook is banking on. If you must leave something in your car be sure and put it in the trunk, crooks can still get to it but it will be more of a hassle. It only takes a bad guy 20 seconds to punch a window and take your property.
- * Always keep your doors and windows locked on your home and your vehicle. Use security hardware on residential doors and windows.
- * Be sure your garage door closes when you leave. There are many reports of residents leaving their garage door up when they leave and they don't even

- realize it. If an animal trips the sensor the door will go up and you are down the road not to return for 8-10 hours giving the bad guys full reign on your garage and home.
- * Lighting and Landscaping: Keep your home well lit at night. Motion sensors, landscape lighting, etc. all help, crooks don't like light. Keep your landscape neatly trimmed and do not cover windows or doors with bushes.

Alarm Ordinance

The City of Walnut Creek has an alarm ordinance, which requires any user of an alarm system that generates police response whether it is monitored by an alarm company or not, to have a valid permit on file. The fee for the alarm permit is free to residences and \$25 for commercial entities to be renewed yearly (which include home based companies). To obtain an alarm permit please email alarm manager@walnutcreekpd.com with your name and address and an application will be mailed to you (the applications are not available on-line at this time) or you can call (925) 943-5885.
