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Neighborhood Concerns Raised at Shadelands Advisory Committee Meeting

The 8th Shadelands Gateway Advisory Committee Meeting was held on July 26th at the Shadelands Art Center. Turnout was robust, with more than 40 people in attendance. The purpose of the meeting was to review, discuss, and begin aligning on Preferred Land Use Plan and development standards. The original plan was to have a total of 9 Advisory Committee Meetings with a resulting Draft Specific Plan recommendation to the City Council regarding the 25-acre parcel of land at Ygnacio Valley Road and Oak Grove Road which Safeway owns and would like rezoned from business to retail so that a shopping center can be built there.



Updates Shown at the July 26th Meeting

Ed Wohlers, a member of the

Advisory Committee and a current Board member of the Woodlands Association, paused the meeting and raised a concern about the entire process. He stated that after nearly 8 months of work, the Committee was ready to start aligning on a Draft Specific Plan without spending any time discussing neighborhood concerns. Ed pointed out that the vast majority of the comments received by the Committee have been opposed to re-zoning the current Safeway property from office space to retail. Issues like traffic and economic impact have not been adequately addressed by the committee. Ed's comments were echoed by other members of the Committee, including Rocco Biale of Rocco's Pizzeria.
