

## Latest Plan for The Orchards Reviewed



The Design Review Commission held a study session at City Hall to discuss the latest site plan for The Orchards proposed 25-acre development at Ygnacio Valley Road and Oak Grove Road on Wednesday, October 16th at 7 p.m.

Deb Karbo, of Property Development Centers, a Safeway Company, presented the updated plan, which includes a children's play area with mounds of grassy earth, water play and a focus on natural creative play spaces. The entrance to the development from Shadelands Drive is, as many commission members pointed out at the meeting, not unlike downtown Pleasant Hill, where there is storefront parking along a curved paved walkway, though there are shops along only one side of the road in the Orchards plan, with parking on the other.

The architect from Lowney Architecture, working for Safeway, answered many of the commission's questions about the Agrarian Modern style of the buildings. He described the viewing deck planned for the rooftop, with a view of Mt. Diablo, where one can



orient oneself" to the natural and urban surroundings." The landscape architect working with Safeway explained that the plants being chosen will require minimal upkeep rather than daily or weekly maintenance.

Design Review Commission Chair Phillip Volkmann expressed that he is not impressed with existing Safeway rooftop parking at other store locations. He suggested a study to look at moving parking underground. Design Review Commission Vice Chair Marilyn Weiss urged that "smart development" is needed to address this large acreage and suggested the removal of Bldg. G from the gateway corner to dedicate the area to the gateway environment.

Commissioner Mike Fotheringham commented that there are not enough trees to call the development the Orchards at this point. "An orchard is a grid, not a series of arcs." Other commissioners discussed putting the children's area where Building K currently is located. This came from concern about too much of the open space bordering the loading zone area behind Safeway, between the loading zone and the Senior Housing development.

This was the first Design Review meeting for the commission's newest member, Joseph Gorny, who had a fresh take on this project that has gone through many changes. One of his first questions was the economic viability of the project, which the architect for Safeway assured is sound. Gorny's overall feedback was that he believes that young families moving to Walnut Creek will want the "walkability" that the development offers. Gorny, along with commission member Mike Fotheringham, was hoping that this would be a "different" kind of store, a "marketplace, gathering place, not standard Safeway shopping market. A place for classes. Wish there was more innovation in the outside/inside." He cautioned against too many angles in buildings and to pay careful attention to design issues and materials utilized.

Two members of the public, both residents the Woodlands, spoke during public comment. They addressed concerns about the viability of an additional supermarket when we have Whole Foods coming to Encina Grande shopping center, the existing Nob Hill Foods, and the existing Safeway at nearby Countrywood Shopping Center. The second speaker commented that the plan renderings show mature, shade-giving trees, where in reality it will take time, years in some cases, for the trees to grow to the sizes illustrated.

Safeway continues to make changes to the plan as part of the process in their request to rezone the 25-acre parcel from Business Park to Planned Development & Mixed Use – Commercial. The next city meeting date has not yet been posted, but we will list it on both www.woodlandsassn.org and www.facebook.com/WoodlandsAssn. The City Council will make its decision on whether to grant rezoning in the near future.

## New Secretary on Woodlands Association Board

The appointment of Bill Gilmyers to Vice President of the Woodlands Association board created a vacancy at the Secretary position. Erik Ehlers, a new board volunteer, was appointed by unanimous vote to serve out the remainder of the Secretary's term through 2014. ## Damaged Trees Removed from Safeway Property

On the recommendation of the City of Walnut Creek arborist, Safeway removed two trees from their property in early November. Both trees were damaged during a recent windstorm, with fallen limbs. As a result, the walkway between the two buildings on the site was also damaged.

With concern for the welfare of employees and visitors, the arborist for the City of Walnut Creek directed Safeway to immediately remove two of the damaged trees at the corporate facility in Walnut Creek. According to the arborist, the trees posed safety risks to pedestrians on the surrounding walkways. The work to remove the trees began Friday, November 8, and was complete by Wednesday, November 13.



## Home Improvement Corner

#### Quick and Easy "Mini-Projects"

As far as I'm concerned there's never a bad time to do a home improvement project. The spring and summer bring long days and the opportunity to work outside, while colder weather means a lot more inside time with nothing more to do than stare at that discolored light switch you've been meaning to replace. That said, picking a do-it-yourself project will be driven by a lot of other factors: cost, amount of time involved, skill required, etc. Today we'll look at some super simple projects that are great for sprucing up your home that are inexpensive fast and easy.

#### **Replace Your Switchplates**

Are the plastic covers for your light switches and electrical outlets looking a bit yellow? If you've got a screwdriver and

a few minutes, this is an easy fix. Replace your plates with the standard white or opt for a different look with wood or colors. A great call for phone and cable jacks as well.

### **Update Your Registers**

This is an improvement that can be both ornamental and functional, with nice looking registers available for your heating and AC that can also improve your airflow. If your registers are in the floor you can just drop these in, if they're in the wall you need to get the screwdriver out, but that's about it, tool-wise.

### Add New Cabinet Hardware

A few new shiny new knobs or drawer pulls can refresh dated cabinets or other furniture. Match them up with other design features in your home or mix and match for a more eclectic look.

#### **Paint a Wall**

Painting your whole house or even a room can be a messy drag. Instead consider painting just one wall a rich vibrant color to add some excitement to a room without overwhelming it. Painting a few doors can add some zip to your interior as well without busting your budget or killing your whole weekend.

What I like about these projects is they allow you to start small and for the most part they can be done gradually as your time permits. None are too expensive and all are easy. So what are you waiting for- get improving!



#### Ingredients:

- 1/2 lb. butter
- 2 c. sugar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 lb. Ricotta
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- Grated rind of 1 orange
- 4 1/2 c. flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda

#### Directions:

Cream butter; add sugar and continue creaming. Add egg and Ricotta and vanilla; beat well. Sift together flour, baking powder and baking soda, salt; add to batter. Drop about a teaspoon of dough on ungreased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degree oven about 10 minutes until edges are lightly browned. Cool.

### FROSTING:

- 2 c. confectionery sugar
- 1/4 c. butter 3 tbsp. milk
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- Mix well and put on top of cookies and sprinkles.

# Major Parking Changes for Downtown Walnut Creek

According to an article in the Contra Costa Times on November 20th written by Elisabeth Nardi, Walnut Creek's downtown parking rates will shoot up to \$2 an hour, Sunday parking will no longer be free, and meter hours will stretch into the night.

The City Council passed the new parking ordinance Tuesday, November 19th. The changes will take effect in the spring, and are expected to bump parking revenue, after expenses, from \$1 million to \$3.1 million annually.

Besides enforcement on Sundays, which Walnut Creek has never done, there will also be a move to change enforcement times to 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. To drive people into the underutilized downtown parking garages, the city will make the first hour free in its structures, but parking rates in the busy South Locust Street garage will rise from 50 cents to \$1 an hour.

All the changes are aimed at reaching a standard parking occupancy rate of 85 percent -- 15 percent availability -- of parking at all times downtown.

Mayor Cindy Silva said the parking-rate and enforcement-hour changes are just one element of an overall parking plan that also includes way-finding signs and parking technology.






