"THE ORCHARDS" DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT RELEASED

Available for Public Review Until February 20th @ 4 p.m.

The Draft Environmental Impact Report for "The Orchards," Safeway's proposed development on the 25-acre parcel at Ygnacio Valley Road and Oak Grove Road, was published earlier this month and is available for public review on the city's website:

www.walnutcreek.org/citygov/depts/cd/planning/ shadelands gateway specific plan.asp

The report addresses in detail: 1) Air Quality and Greenhouse Gas Emissions, 2) Biological Resources, 3) Cultural Resources, 4) Geotechnical [Geology & Soils], 5) Hazards and Hazardous Materials, 6) Hydrology & Water Quality, 7) Noise, 8) Public Services, 9) Traffic, and 10) Urban Decay.

A hard copy of the DEIR is on file with the Community Development Department at City Hall, 1666 N. Main Street, Second Floor, Walnut Creek, and available for review during regular business hours, Monday -Thursday, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

After all comments have been received, a Final EIR will be prepared, the Planning Commission will consider the information in the EIR and make a recommendation to the City Council, and the City Council will consider certification of the Final EIR and make a decision on the Project at a public hearing, the dates of which are yet to be determined. Separate public notice of those hearings will be provided by the city at a later date. WALNUT CREEK'S NEW MAYOR: KRISTINA LAWSON

Kristina Lawson, who has been a Walnut Creek City Councilmember since November 2010, was recently installed as Mayor for 2013-2014, having been voted in unanimously by the city council.

Prior to her election to the city council, Lawson was a member of the Walnut Creek Planning Commission. Mayor Lawson is a partner at Manatt, Phelps & Phillips, LLP, a Real Estate and Land Use practice. Lawson lives in Walnut Creek with her husband, Matt, and their two children.

Serving as Mayor during the city's Centennial, Lawson acknowledges the challenges that lay ahead, and she looks to the past for insight, stating that Walnut Creek incorporated in 1914 to pave Main Street and solve the problem of cars getting stuck in the mud. The city has grown from 500 residents then to 65,000 residents now. For 100 years the city has been overcoming challenges and welcoming progress: Mayor Lawson expects that same spirit to continue.

Walnut Creek's New Mayor: Kristina Lawson: Continued

One of her two goals is to have the city council work together to solve the city's problems. Lawson is planning 5 council policy meetings during the year, with each 2-hour session focusing on a different topic, including demographics, urban agriculture, traffic and driving habits, and how Walnut Creek can be a regional leader.

Secondly, Lawson will be spending a day each month working alongside city workers to better understand what city workers do and how they keep the city running. In December she rode in a street sweeper for 90 minutes of the sweeper's route, toured the city's building maintenance

department where a staff of six manages more than 100 city buildings, visited the conference room where city employees coordinate responses to emergencies, and met employees in the parks department before stopping at the traffic operations center across the street.

CONFIRMATION THAT SAFEWAY WILL CAUSE ECONOMIC BLIGHT IN THE WOODLANDS

"Safeway's proposed shopping center in the Shadelands is expected to lead to the closure of the Nob Hill grocery store in the Citrus Markeplace shopping center, which would also leave the shopping center without an anchor." That bleak outcome is according to ALH Economics' Urban Decay Analysis of Safeway's proposed shopping center. (Available at http:// www.walnut-creek.org/civicax/filebank/blobdload.aspx?BlobID=8282). Safeway's proposed 55,000 square foot supermarket in the Shadelands and Whole Foods' 37,500 square foot replacement of Safeway in the Encina Grande shopping center will "more than double the increment of existing grocery store space [in our neighborhood]. ALH Economics believes this is "more grocery store space than can be supported at this market location." The Urban Decay Analysis goes on to state: "One prospective candidate for [loss of] sales high enough to prompt store closures is the Nob Hill grocery store in nearby Citrus Marketplace. This store was identified as a prospective candidate for closure following the opening of just [Safeway's] Project. The likelihood of store closure appears even greater if the Whole Foods store opens in the redeveloped Encina Grande shopping center."

When Citrus Marketplace loses Nob Hill, undercutting the viability of the center's other tenants, we can look across the street to see the urban

decay that may ultimately result at this entrance to the Woodlands. In 2010, the graffiti-ridden site at 2153 Oak Grove (the former location of the HMS Endeavor restaurant at the northwest corner of Oak Grove and Shadelands) had apparently become a shelter for transients who may have inadvertently set fire to the vacant building at the site. (See http://www.mercurynews.com/breaking-news/ci_16788268). Three years later, the property is still vacant and rundown. Thanks to Safeway's proposal, a vacant Nob Hill and a deteriorating Citrus Marketplace may become a similar nuisance at the gateway to our neighborhood.

Keeping Citrus Marketplace from becoming a dying shopping center does not require a complete rejection of Safeway's proposed shopping center—it requires only that Safeway's proposed development not include a supermarket. The City Council can give Safeway almost its entire wish-list of a free rezoning—just take the supermarket out of the proposal so that Safeway's success does not come from cannibalizing business from Nob Hill and devastating the Citrus Marketplace shopping center. Our City Council should not permit Safeway to enrich itself by blighting our neighborhood. Valentine's Day Recipe: Chocolate Truffles

Chocolate Truffles Recipe

Total Time: 1 hr 53 min

Prep: 20 min

Inactive: 1 hr 30 min

Cook: 3 min
Yield: 60 truffles

Ingredients:

- 1/2 pound good bittersweet chocolate such as Lindt
- 1/2 pound good semisweet chocolate such as Ghiradelli
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons Grand Marnier, optional
- 1 tablespoon prepared coffee



- 1/2 teaspoon good vanilla extract
- · Confectioners' sugar
- Cocoa powder

Directions:

Chop the chocolates finely with a sharp knife. Place them in a heat-proof mixing bowl.

Heat the cream in a small saucepan until it just boils. Turn off the heat and allow the cream to sit for 20 seconds. Pour the cream through a finemeshed sieve into the bowl with chocolate. With a wire whisk, slowly stir the cream and chocolates together until the chocolate is completely melted. Whisk in the Grand Marnier, if using, coffee, and vanilla.

Set aside at room temperature for 1 hour.

With 2 teaspoons, spoon round balls of the chocolate mixture onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Refrigerate for 30 minutes, until firm. Roll each dollop of chocolate in your hands to roughly make a round ball. Roll in confectioners' sugar, cocoa powder, or both. These will keep refrigerated for weeks, but serve at room temperature. Contra Costa Canal Shut Down For Repairs & Annual Cleaning

The Contra Costa Canal was shut down Dec. 2, 2013 for repairs and its annual cleaning, scheduled during the winter months to lessen the impact to customers and the environment. Because of this, portions of the Canal Trail, from Clyde to Martinez, will be closed for cleaning as well.

The annual cleaning begins at the Naval Weapons Station and will proceed along the Canal Loop through Clyde, Concord, Walnut Creek, Pleasant Hill and Martinez. Trail users will need to detour around the construction sites.

The canal is expected to be repaired and back in service by the beginning of the annual irrigation season in April. 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
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


