#### Valle Verde Elementary Field Committee: Field Update

On behalf of the VVE Field Committee, we would like to thank the school and the neighboring community for their support and patience this summer during field renovations. As you can see, a lot of progress has been made. There are still a few components of the project that remain outstanding. As a result, we are writing to inform the community about what they can expect to see when school starts and to give an updated timeline on when the project will be completed in its entirety.



The VVE Field Project began as a collaboration between Principal Mignon Perkins, VVE parents and students, and MDUSD administrators. Years of drought and State mandated cutbacks on water usage left the field in bad shape. The dry soil also made it an ideal place for gophers and ground squirrels to burrow which caused even more damage to the field. The VVE Field Committee has been meeting extensively with the District over the past school year and we have come up with a comprehensive plan that will restore the track and field to its former glory.

Renovations to the VVE Field began in late June of this year. The first phase was to eliminate the presence of gophers and ground squirrels. This task proved to be very challenging and will continue to be a part of the field maintenance plan provided by MDUSD Maintenance and Operations in the Fall and Spring Seasons every year. The field was aerated, fertilized, and seeded with additional soil. Irrigation was repaired and replaced to ensure proper watering. Fencing was erected and gates providing access to the field were locked to ensure the field would not be disturbed during this process. The hope was that the field would be ready to use by the first day of school. However, the Field Committee has met and assessed that the grass needs additional time to establish before it can be used. As such, the fences will remain up and the gates locked until the second week of September when the Field Committee will again assess the state of the field and provide updates.

In addition to the field, MSUSD will be fully repaving our track and will be paving the dirt area under the solar panels. The first half of the track will be paved the week of August 13th. The second half of the track will be paved as soon as the grass is established and able to endure the weight of the paving machinery. The goal is for paving to be completed by the end of September (before the VVE Fun Run). The Field Committee will keep the community updated on the progress of the track paving.

The Field Project has also been extended by the District to include campus beautification. Specifically, the front of school will be landscaped this school year. Tree removal has already begun by the front office and additional planting and installation of pavers will occur to give the school more curb appeal and to provide a proper place for students to wait for parents when the school day ends.

Again, thank you all for your support. We are thrilled with the progress so far and are excited for the school and the community to use the new track and field soon!
