#### **WOODLANDS HISTORY**

With the Woodlands Newsletter, this very document you're taking the time to read, facing down the barrel of having just a few more months to live, I wanted to dig into the archives to examine what the newsletter may have covered in the past:

- August, 1971 Out in the hinterlands that are Walnut Creek, Woodlands residents have complained that it takes up
  to 7 minutes to get to the other side of Walnut Creek. With few options beyond the new, high-tech Safeway across
  Ygnacio, most residents endure the long drive to reach friends and shopping in the older parts of the city. In the
  Woodlands, the big new craze is going casual around the neighborhood several men were spotted without ties, and
  a few wives even wore pants instead of skirts or dresses. What a modern world!
- March 1985 After an exciting show at the Pavilion, Michael Jackson was rumored to be visiting the Woodlands. The photograph attached to the article was blurry enough to be a Bigfoot sighting, but several local teens who attended Ygnacio Valley High, the Woodlands home high school, swore they saw the King of Pop near Valle Verde Elementary.
- May 1988 Several local young men, sporting awesome mullets and day glow neon shorts that reached almost
  halfway to their knees were spotted throwing water balloons at passing Plymouth Voyagers and Ford Tauruses. They
  would have thrown the projectiles at other vehicles as well, but everyone in the neighborhood now drives one of
  those two cars.
- December 1996 Holidays in the Woodlands were an eventful time, as a delegation from the Woodlands sister neighborhood, Desert Brush, brought gifts as part of a cultural exchange. Unfortunately, tragedy erupted as the visitors didn't look both ways on Citrus and were the victim of a hit and run by a rotund character on a sleigh who was cutting through the neighborhood on his way from the Safeway offices somewhere to the east.
- September 2000 the Y2K glitch was the only thing that could bring an end to the hostilities between Diablo Shadows and the Woodlands. After a small number of Diablo Shadows residents requested that their neighborhood be annexed, Woodlands Board members moved to officially notify Alta Vista that the neighborhood south of Ygnacio would henceforth be known as Woodlands 2: the Wannabes. However, Woodlands residents preferred to maintain a buffer and overwhelmingly voted to recall the board that had agreed to the plan.
- February 2015 Developers launched their new plan to convert Citrus Avenue across from the Citrus Marketplace
  into housing built solely from shipping containers. While neighbors attempted to balance their desire to have
  everyone in the bay area find a place to live with the reality that any new construction at this end of Walnut Creek
  would be environmentally destructive, due to the need new residents would have to drive anywhere they went.
  Similarly, developers tried to balance their desire to make every cent possible with, well, no other driving force.
  Thankfully, all that's now behind us...
